



Fr. Panayiotis' Message

September 2013

"Holiness befits thy house, O LORD, for evermore." (Psa. 93:5)



Dear friends and parishioners,

We now live in the after-effects of the consecration of our sanctuary. We have dedicated it to God in a very special way. We have sanctified it though prayer and anointing, and most especially through the sacred relics of His martyrs which are now permanently buried in the Holy Altar Table. Every time we enter the church, we are entering dedicated, sacred, holy space. We are standing on holy ground. Let's absorb this sacredness; allow ourselves to be infused with God's Grace.

What else is there for us to do now? Simply put, it is time to also sanctify ourselves through a life acceptable to Him. We should become holy as God is holy: "Since we have these promises, beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from every defilement of body

and spirit, and make holiness perfect in the fear of God." (<u>2Cor. 7:1</u>) "For God has not called us for uncleanness, but in holiness." (<u>1Th. 4:7</u>)

Our personal holiness is what proclaims God's Love and Power. It is through us that God is honored and glorified. It is through us that His light shines in this world to illuminate those who are still in darkness. His holiness is available to us as we join at every Divine Liturgy. His Grace and power comes to us every time we honor Him with our good works.

The Summer activities and vacations are over. A new Ecclesiastical Year begins on September 1st. The schools are now open, the Ministries of the parish are re-energized. This is a good time for new resolutions with respect to our spiritual life. I would ask that each one of us makes a New Year's resolution, a commitment to try to improve our spiritual standing in front of God by doing the following:

- 1. Spend a few more minutes in prayer every day. (If you need a prayer book or help with how to pray, please feel free to ask me for guidance).
- 2. Spend a few minutes reading the Biblical Readings of the Day (again, help is available).
- 3. Pick up a spiritual book from the list available at the Bookstore and/or Library and get inspired by the lives and wisdom of the Fathers and Mothers of the Church.
- 4. Make an effort to attend Divine Liturgy from the beginning at 10:00 am.
- 5. Make an effort to attend the Orthros Service on Sunday at least once a month.
- 6. Make an effort to attend the Great Vespers Service on Saturday at least once a month.

God is waiting to shower you with His Grace. The ball is now in your court. Your positive response is expected for the process to begin.

Let us strive for peace with ourselves and with God. Let us "Strive for peace with all men, and for the holiness without which no one will see the Lord." (<u>Heb. 12:14</u>)



The Miracle of the Archangel Michael at Colossae

Commemorated on September 6

In Phrygia, not far from the city of Hieropolis, in a place called Colossae, there was a church dedicated to the Archangel Michael, near which flowed a holy spring. This church was built by a resident of the city of Laodicia in gratitude to God and the Archangel Michael for healing his mute daughter. The holy Archangel Michael appeared to this man in a dream and revealed to him that his daughter would receive the gift of speech after drinking from the water of the spring. The girl did receive healing at the spring and began to speak. After this miracle, the father and his daughter with all their family were baptized. In fervent gratitude, the father built a church in honor of the holy Archangel Michael. Both Christians and pagans begin to come to the spring for healing and many of the pagans turned from their idols and were converted to faith in Christ.

At this church of the holy Archangel Michael, a pious man, Archippus, served for sixty years as the church custodian. By his preaching and by the example of his God-pleasing life he brought many pagans to faith in Christ. Other pagans who hated Christians in general and especially hated Archippus plotted to destroy the church in order to prevent people from coming to that holy place of healing, and at the same time to kill Archippus.

To this end they diverted two rivers and directed their combined flow against the church. Archippus prayed fervently to the Archangel Michael asking him to ward off the danger threatening the church and holy spring. Through his prayer the Archangel Michael appeared near the church, and by means of the Cross and a great earthquake that shook the entire area, diverted the waters into an underground course, thus the church remained unharmed. Seeing such an awesome miracle, the pagans fled in terror. Archippus and the Christians gathered in the church, glorified God and gave thanks to the holy Archangel Michael for his help. The place where the rivers plunged into a fissure received the name "Chonae", which means "funnels" in Greek.

"Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective." James 5:16



As I reflect on my second period of time spent in Moldova, I am reminded how wonderful it feels to belong. Throughout those two weeks, I was greeted with hugs and smiles from the counselors who I had previously worked with as well as many of the same campers. Their response to me was always warm and welcoming, pleasantly surprised that I had fulfilled my promise to them to return and work alongside them to continue building a stronger youth program in Moldova. This place has become like home to me, a place where I will always be welcome and where I will always belong.

I was blessed by many encounters with the people of Moldova, and I was struck most by a comment made by a fellow counselor, Raj. He expressed how wonderful he thought it was that as Americans, we use our money to help others instead of buying expensive things for ourselves, like cars. I remember sitting there incredulous at the words he had spoken. My first thought was to laugh and tell him how incredibly wrong he was, that we are often much more concerned with buying ourselves trendy clothes, fast cars, and the latest version of the iPhone. Instead, I thought what a beautiful opportunity this was for us to do Christ's work in a part of the world that was willing to listen and a reminder of what our lives are supposed to be about: living as a selfless servant prepared to go wherever led to help those in need.

In His Great Commission, Christ commanded His followers to "go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" (Matthew 28:19). Over 4.8 billion people in this world still have not heard of the hope and love that comes from knowing Jesus Christ. Even among those who are already our brothers and sisters in Christ, many face extreme poverty, famine, and war. Christ does not ask us to go and serve; he commands us.

Our team was given a lot of trust and consideration from the beginning simply because of the country we were from. We always felt welcome and were often looked to as leaders. When we spoke, people listened with interest and respect. We come from a nation that has been given a favored position among many, and we should use that immense privilege and strong voice to help and serve others throughout the world.

The youth camp in which I worked this year was successful in its purpose: to bring youth from around Moldova together in order to build meaningful relationships with them and to surround them with the love and feeling of peace that comes from their faith. The day we left camp, I looked around to see many of the youth crying, tears streaming down their face, at the thought of leaving the family they had formed in the past five days. It was both heartbreaking and satisfying to realize that these youth had formed such close bonds with each other that it had become extremely painful to be torn apart. We said our heartfelt goodbyes, and I was reminded again of what Raj had said. Our calling is to love unconditionally and to give generously. We were instructed to follow Him with unfailing faith and to spread His steadfast love throughout the world. It is only through this sacrifice that we will find a sense of belonging and true home among those whom He calls His children.



To All Parishioners:

Thank you again to those who volunteered during our recent Marietta Greek Festival. Hopefully, I have seen most of you and thanked you personally. I also hope you have all had a chance to recover and catch up on your other responsibilities over the past three months.

Final Festival results have been compiled. As you might expect, the threat of rain on Saturday and downpour on Sunday of the Festival hurt attendance. We hosted a total of 10,352 guests over the weekend, down from a record 16,670 last year. But, although the weather did not cooperate as we would have liked, this year's Festival showed a profit to the church of \$103,631 on gross sales of approximately \$281,000. As in past years, \$15,000 of this net profit will be paid to the church operating fund to cover incurred costs such as utilities, repairs, cleaning, etc.

We should all be proud of the financial success of the Festival despite less than ideal weather conditions. But, the Festival was also a success in many other respects. A record 3100 of our attendees took advantage of our sanctuary tour. Our new Greek Yogurt and Greek Fries booths had mixed results, but showed enough promise, in my opinion, to warrant their return next year. The cafeteria-style food service we instituted in 2012 continued to show dividends in speed of service and expenditures per guest. Our Visitor's Guide set a new record for sales, grossing \$31,430. And, finally, don't forget the fellowship and camaraderie developed amongst our parishioners as a result of working for a common cause, both during and in preparation for the Festival.

I am so proud of, and thankful to, our community and its leadership for again coming together to host a successful Festival. Although this is the time of year for us to rest, please consider volunteering for a leadership position in next year's Festival. Our Parish has purchased 50 plots, which we are making available at a reduced price of \$2,900. This price includes one plot with a vault.


