


Directions to our Parish:

Fr. Panapiotis' Message





"Do not be conformed to this world but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may prove what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect." (Romans 12:2)

As we are approaching the most holy of times in our Church life, the Holy and Great Week and Pascha, I would like to share with you a few thoughts:

There is something very special about this time and the events it reminds us of. There is something very special about Holy Week.

In the wisdom that God gives the worshipping community of the faithful (the Church) we have been handed down along the

centuries a most amazing set of hymns, prayers and services in which we can immerse ourselves during this period of preparation for the great Feast of the Resurrection of Christ. Hymns filled with theological wisdom and services designed to transport us back to the events of Christ's life fill and sanctify the time of Holy Week.

The ultimate goal of these hymns and services is to help us transform ourselves from secular to spiritual beings; they are meant to help us connect with God in a mystical way, so that we may be sanctified. They are made for us and our salvation.

The only reason why these hymns, prayers and services might have had little effect on us in the past is, perhaps, because we have not given them a good chance.

How can anyone live through the services of Holy Week, starting with Palm Sunday, and not experience in a real way the events of the Passion and Crucifixion of Christ. How can one not feel the pain and sorrow of the Virgin Mary as she beholds her son on the Cross and carries away His dead body to burial. And, finally, how can one not experience the joy and triumph of God over death as the light shines through the darkness on Holy Saturday night spreading joy to the heart as the Lord is Risen from the dead.

Come join us, brothers and sisters. Here is where the miracle of our Faith takes place. Here is where our hearts and minds are transformed by His power.

Let us give God a chance to reach in our hearts and heal our wounds. Let us approach Him humbly and prayerfully. Let us offer ourselves to God in Faith and Trust during this Holy Week so that the miracle of the Resurrection might happen in us, as well.

Come, let us taste Heaven together in the here and now!

What is the Greek Orthodox Church?

A quick historical and theological presentation

The Greek Orthodox Church traces its roots back to the Apostles, especially St. Paul.

She still uses the original Greek language, in which all the books of the New Testament were first written.

She considers herself as the original Church, the result of the natural development from Judaism to Christianity. Her early members were the Jews of the 1st century (New Testament people) who accepted Jesus as the Christ - who all spoke Greek at the time - who converted the Gentiles (non-Jews) from paganism and established the first Christian communities around the Mediterranean basin.

She holds on to many of the basic early Christian traditions, including the worship services, spirituality and theology, which are rooted in the Early Christian Church.

She considers herself to be the Mother Church, from whom all the other Christian groups subsequently evolved.

She proclaims God as Trinity (three persons - Father, Son and Holy Spirit).

She believes that the Son (the Logos (Word)) of God became man in the person of Jesus Christ, He died on the Cross and rose from the dead to perfect humanity in Himself and restore it from the sinful condition to the immortal, perfected state, which God intended for us from the beginning. This final perfected state of humanity is the state of eternal salvation attained through Faith in Jesus Christ.







Our parish depends on what each one of us does. Let's all do our fair share out of love for God and each other.





A large part of the responsibility for a person's spiritual state lies with the family. For children to be released from their various inner problems, it is not enough for them to receive good advice, or to be compelled by force; nor do logical arguments or threats do any good. These things rather make matters worse. The solution is to be found through the sanctification of the parents. Become holy people and you will have no problems with your children. The sanctity of their parents releases the children from their problems. You parents should pray silently to Christ with upraised arms and embrace your children mystically. When they misbehave, you will take some disciplinary measures, but you will not coerce them. Above all, you need to pray.

Proclamation for Greek Independence March 24, 2014 At the Georgia State Capitol in Atlanta, Georgia

March 25, 1821 marks the beginning of the Revolution of the Greek people against the oppression of the Muslim Turks, which lasted about 400 years.

The Ottoman overlords retaliated immediately by hanging the Patriarch of Constantinople Gregorios V and the Archbishop of Cyprus Kyprianos. They also put to death the bishops of Cyprus along more than 470 lay leaders of the Christian people of Cyprus. Many Cypriots left the island to fight along with their brothers of the mainland.

They assumed that the Revolution could be drowned in blood, but they miscalculated the resolve for freedom of these abused people.

The plight of the Greeks reached the Europeans, who watched the bloodshed take place. Eventually, the political leadership payed attention, as well, and help was sent to the cause of the Greeks.

The modern Greek state was established in 1830. The people of Cyprus had to wait for another half century until the British decided to rent Cyprus from the Ottoman Turks in 1887.

The Turks returned to Cyprus in 1974 with tanks and warplanes, bringing death and destruction again to a much pained people.
