
#### **Directions to our Parish:**

#### Fr. Panapiotis' Message

#### Jesus: The Recipe for Peace for the Middle East



As the killing rages in Gaza I cannot help but wonder what could be the solution to this very complicated and emotionally charged problem (emotional even for Americans-if you watch the daily news and commentaries!).

Of course, I cannot imagine that the desired peaceful solution will come if Hamas continues firing rockets into Israel killing Jews, nor can I see peace come if the Israeli army continues the killing of Palestinian Moslems. This has already been happening for over 66 years and it has only made things worse.

So, I raise the question: What is the solution that can lead to Peace in the Holy Land and the Middle East? And my answer is, Jesus, Yeshua (ישוע), Tsā - al Masih (בעער)!!!

It is my contention that it will greatly help the cause of peace if the Israeli Jews were to look again at Jesus (one of their own) and consider His teaching as an option for their nation (since His teaching was originally meant for them, anyway).

Of course, Jesus's message was first for the Jews, but not only. It is also for the Moslems, as well as everyone else!

The Moslems, in turn, need to take a closer look in the Quran and re-consider Jesus, the Messenger of God, and His teachings concerning war and peace.

Interestingly enough, the Quran shows great respect for Jesus as a Prophet and calls Him "the Messenger of God" and "the Word of God", yet many Moslems do not pay enough attention to His teachings.

Jesus has a good message for the world; He spoke about gentleness and peace; He declared that, "blessed are the peacemakers" and "blessed are the meek". He did not teach that people should kill one another, either for revenge, or for land, neither for faith nor for God, nor for any other reason, and definitely not as a way to paradise!

Jesus raised the bar further by asking us not just to not seek revenge (as is the case in the dictum "an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth"), but even to "turn the other cheek". He went beyond the norm, encouraging people to not only love those who love them, but also "love their enemies"!

Not only did Jesus not preach violence and the killing of the others, but He went to great lengths to emphasize the new message of the New Covenant, "peace on earth": Before His crucifixion, when the Jewish guards came to the Garden of Gesthemane to arrest Him, Peter pulled out his knife and cut the ear of the servant of the high priest. But Jesus healed the man by re-attaching his ear. He then rebuked Peter asking him to put his knife away saying, "if you live by the knife, you will also die by the knife" (which accurately describes the current state of affairs in the Middle-East).

If the Moslems of the Middle-East want to really follow the Quran and honor Jesus as a great Prophet and Messenger of God, it will be a good idea for them to heed to His message, as well. This will bring peace among themselves, as well as with those around them.

On the Israeli side, those who profess to be Jews today and claim to honor Yahweh cannot ignore Jesus, for the people of his time (their own forefathers) proclaimed Him to be the Messiah (the

Christ) promised by God to His chosen people. Both His miracles and His teachings stand out in the history of the Jewish people (and of the whole world) as extraordinary. Millions of people continue to believe in Him as the Messiah, the One promised to the Jews through the prophets in the ancient Scriptures. Judaism will be greatly enriched and Yahweh will be greatly pleased if modern Jews will consider Jesus and His teachings as a complement to the teachings of the old Scriptures (the Old Testament), which they still abide by.

As followers of Jesus Christ, we have an obligation to present His authentic teachings to both Jews and Moslems (and the rest of the world) as we have inherited them from the Apostles. We are called to live the Gospel and witness the True Faith to those willing to listen. The Gospel becomes more effective when those who preach it actually live by it. There should be no compromise of the Gospel for the sake of nationalistic, political or emotional leanings toward any one side of the conflict in the Middle-East.

#### Good news for Sudanese woman

Some good news arrived today on the international front. The Sudanese woman, Meriam Ibrahim, married to an American citizen who was grabbed by regional Sudanese authorities, tried, and sentenced to death for converting to Christianity was set free. According to the way in which the Sudanese apply Sharia law, because her father was Muslim, Meriam is also Muslim. Any Muslim who converts away from Islam is worthy of the death penalty, and so she was sentenced to death while pregnant. Fortunately for Meriam, she had been grabbed by authorities and not by a mob, so the sentence was not carried out while she appealed it. Eventually she won her appeal and was set free, however, she was promptly arrested again at the airport under some trumped up charge of trying to use false travel documents. Meriam was released on bail and was able to go to the USA Embassy and get asylum.

Details are not out yet, however, Italy admitted that it had had a part in getting Meriam and her family out. She landed at the airport in Rome, accompanied by her children and an Italian Member of Parliament. The Italian Prime Minister greeted her shortly after her arrival. Whatever happened, her own lawyer in the Sudan was not aware that she was leaving. On interview, he said that the legal travel ban against her was still in effect. I doubt that any European country or the USA will honor any extradition request. She is fortunate in being married to an American citizen. I am sure that the USA will waive the normal procedures and give Meriam a green card under a sped up case review allowed by law for those with a particular emergency refugee need. Being originally sentenced to 100 lashes and then the death penalty for being a Christian is most definitely an emergency need. Meanwhile, a very special thanks to the government of Italy. They deserve all our applause.

The world is in a period of radicalization. From the returning Caliphate, to the separatists in the Ukraine, to the radicalization of Muslims in northern and sub-Saharan Africa, to the increasing militancy of Hindus in India, we are seeing a world that may very well be headed toward some type of social/cultural explosion. We have not been immune from that climate here in the USA. However, we remain free of physical conflict and internal terrorism. For that we are to be thankful. It is when I read stories like the story of Meriam that I realize how thankful I am that we Americans may scream a lot, but we have not yet descended to physically harming of each other.

There are still many countries that have not yet felt violent social upheaval. May the Lord continue to preserve them.







#### STEWARDSHIP CORNER

#### Status of General Fund Stewardship as of July 17, 2014

Much of the news concerning our collective stewardship to the General Fund (for the parish's operation) is good. We have about as many members (people returning a Membership/ Stewardship Form indicating what they plan to donate) as we did last year, and these members indicated they will collectively donate significantly more this year. Furthermore the average amount to be donated is \$91 more and the median (typical individual/couple) is \$80 more per individual/couple than last year.

On the flip side, although our collective donations to the General Fund for the first four months of the year had been more than what was needed to meet the budget, during the summer this changed. As of June 15, 2014 we have collectively donated only 88% of the amount budgeted. There are two major factors contributing to this deficit: (1) 12% of the members have not yet donated anything to the General Fund in spite of their promise they would be doing so. And (2) 17% of the members are behind what they indicated that they would be donating monthly. If these patterns continue, the parish will experience a General Fund deficit for the second consecutive year.

#### WE URGE THE FOLLOWING!

- (1) That everyone participating in our parish, please begin to donate this month.
- (2) That everyone who has not yet donated at least half of what they indicated they would this year, please make a special effort to become current by mid-August.
- (3) That everyone who has been well blessed by God this year, please seriously consider donating in thanksgiving to Him an extra portion of His blessings for the expansion of His earthly work.

Thanks for taking the time to read this stewardship update.

May God's love and blessings continue for our parish and all of our members.

#### To All Parishioners:

Thank you again to those who volunteered during our recent Marietta Greek Festival. Hopefully, I have seen most of you and thanked you personally. I also hope you have all had a chance to recover and catch up on your other responsibilities over the past three months.

Final Festival results have been compiled. As you might expect, the rain on Saturday morning and most of the day on Sunday of the Festival hurt attendance. In addition, we had an issue with much of our direct mail not arriving in homes until after the Festival. Nevertheless, we hosted a total of 9100 guests over the weekend, down from 10,392 last year and a record 16,670 in 2012. But, although the weather did not cooperate as we would have liked, this year's Festival showed a profit to the church of \$78,293 on gross sales of approximately \$273,131. As in past years, \$15,000 of this net profit will be paid to the church operating fund to cover incurred costs such as utilities, repairs, cleaning, etc.

Although our profit this year was a little disappointing, we should be very proud of what we accomplished. The Festival was a success in many respects. We estimate that over 3000 of our attendees took advantage of our sanctuary tour. We purchased a substantial amount of new equipment for our food service lines and picnic tables for our pavilion area. We supported the local community by donating part of our revenue to worthy causes such as Jacobs Ladder, Loving Arms Cancer Outreach and the Shepherd Center. The cafeteria-style food service we instituted in 2012 continued to show dividends in speed of service and expenditures per guest, improving in both areas. Our recycling effort in the kitchen was a huge success, filling an entire 20-cubic-yard container with recyclable waste by mid-day Friday of the Festival. An expanded Greek Heritage Exhibit was very popular with our guests. Our Visitor's Guide again set a record for sales, grossing \$31,705. An exit survey gave us information we have never previously collected. Interestingly, 57% of our attendees heard about the Festival via word-of-mouth, with 18% from billboards and 17% from TV and the Internet. And, finally, don't forget the fellowship and camaraderie developed amongst our parishioners as a result of working for a common cause, both during, and in preparation for, the Festival.

I am so proud of, and thankful to, our community and its leadership for again coming together to host a successful Festival. Although this is the time of year for us to rest, please consider volunteering for a leadership position in next year's Festival. 
