


Directions to our Parish:

Fr. Panapiotis' Message

Time is of the Essence



There is much celebration about the coming of a new year; we throw parties, we sing and dance celebrating the passing of the old and the birth of the new.

There are people, however, who look at the passage of time as sad; they see it as time gone that will never return, leading all to aging and corruption, to death and the end of life.

From the Christian perspective, however, time is a gift from God that never ends. We have received this gift of time so that we may make the best use of it with the ultimate goal to win "Eternal Time", the Kingdom of God.

Time has been blessed by God by His entrance into our time through His birth as a human being and His life on earth in the person of Jesus Christ. Since then we have been considering time as sacred. Every year is a year

of salvation and holiness. We have even begun to count time from Jesus' birth. All time belongs to Him. We are now entering the year 2015 A.D. (Anno Domini) - the 2015th year of the Lord.

We celebrate this gift of time in our worship services and especially the Divine Liturgy. Through prayer, we sanctify time as we enter from ordinary time ($\chi\rho\delta\nu\sigma$) into sacred time ($\kappa\alpha\iota\rho\delta\varsigma$) and experience in the here and now the "Eternal Time", the Kingdom of God. Through sacred time we transcend ordinary time; we are able to go back in time and experience the biblical events, and we are also able to move forward into future time and experience "Eternal Time", the Kingdom of God.

While we sanctify time through our prayer, we also sanctify the space in which we exist. As we worship in a given space invoking the Holy Spirit to come and bless us, that space is also blessed; it becomes sacred, dedicated to holy things; it becomes a Holy Sanctuary.

The sacred symbols and signs, the holy icons and other liturgical items, dedicated exclusively for use in our worship, mark this space. As we enter an Orthodox church, we immediately know that this space is sacred. It is set apart for a holy purpose; the sanctification of our time and our life; the sanctification of our souls and our bodies.

Hence time is of the essence, and we need to make it holy. Our space is also of the essence, as it helps us sanctify our time. This is why our sanctuaries and the time we spend in them have to become central to our lives. The experience we bring away every time we enter our worship space is of the utmost importance, most especially for the children; the church experience becomes a powerful force that shapes their souls and defines the course of their lives. We need to make sure that no time is lost, that the souls of the young ones are being sanctified. We need to make sure through teaching and prayer that every minute spent in church is truly sanctifying time.

As for those of us who are older, we already know that we are running out of time on this earth, so we must make good use of our remaining time. As the new year shines upon us, offering us again the gift of time, let us make the right choices which will ensure the sanctification of our time on earth and open the doors into "Eternal Time" in the Kingdom of God. Time is of the Essence!

Let's not waste any time!

The need for Orthodox Schools in America Orthodox Education has the potential to transform lives The Orthodox way of life and thinking can transform society

The Primary Mission of the Orthodox Church is to transmit the Faith of the Apostles to the world, thus transforming lives and the world itself.

The Orthodox Church has preserved the original Apostolic Faith pure and unblemished.

The Orthodox Church did not experience a reformation or counter reformation, because the Faith was kept untouched by time and people. That does not mean all Orthodox people are always perfect, but that the Faith has remained perfect.

If the Orthodox Church in America is to succeed in its primary mission to bring the Gospel of Salvation and Sanctification to the world, we must continually return to the core Faith, to the prime theological teachings of the divinity of Christ and the salvation offered through Him.

We also need to establish our own schools where we will cultivate in our children the Orthodox Christian principles of life as the early Christians did. We cannot shape souls effectively unless we undertake a serious effort of immersion of our people from a young age in the Faith and Orthodox way of life. A serious Christian education is the way to do that. An Orthodox Christian education in particular is the only way to counter the intellectual onslaught of the secular society upon the minds of our people.

For years, as immigrants (Greeks, Russians, Serbs and others), we sought to establish ourselves as a respectable minority in America. We have succeeded and surpassed most other minorities. We now stand at a crossroads: we either continue to seek further political and societal acceptance through the use of the wealth God has given us, or we turn our focus to the greatest treasure we have, the ORTHODOX FAITH, and find ways to effectively share it with those around us.

We can either use our wealth to further impress the secular world with our successes, so that we can continue to gain their respect and recognition, or we can seek ways to present the treasure of ancient Christianity that has been handed down to us by creating opportunities for theological education for those around us, especially those who are looking for authentic Christian teaching. Do we become anchored citizens of this world through our secular successes, or do we cultivate our citizenship in heaven through a witness of authentic Christian life?


This is a critical moment in the life of our Parish, as well. We have established ourselves by the grace of God as a respectable "faith group" in this corner of the earth. People are now ready to listen to us if we do have a serious message to offer. But we need to first understand what this message really is and make it an integral part of our own lives. As a group of people who claim to be followers of Christ, we need to begin living according to His teaching. People around us have to recognize us from our love for each other and our good works. We need to make a mark in the local community as both philanthropists as well as lovers of God. Then we will be able to make a difference in American Society, not through monetary wealth, but rather through the Wealth of the Orthodox Faith and Traditions that we have inherited.

Let's imitate the Early Christians in their willingness to sacrifice wealth and self for the Lord!


BEGINNING THE NEW YEAR RIGHT!





Feast of the Three Hierarchs - Celebration of Hellenic Learning

In 11th century Constantinople every conversation turned to the same controversy: Which of the three 4th-century saints was the greatest in the Orthodox church? Was it St. Basil the Great, the beloved spiritual leader who created orphanages and hospitals and left a legacy of great spiritual and theological writings in the finest form of the Greek language? Was it St. Gregory the Theologian, whose leadership kept the church together during a time of theological crisis and also contributed beautiful works of poetry and prose to the literary corpus of Hellenic learning? Or was is St. John Chrysostom, the wonderful speaker who had "a mouth of gold" and left behind a great legacy of writings in the Hellenic tongue which parallel the great philosophers and rhetoricians of classical times? In 1081, Bishop John of Galatia had a vision in which the three saints appeared to him telling him that they were equal in the eyes of God. The church set aside a day to commemorate their equality. Since then, Hellenes around the world have celebrated this day as the holiday of the Three Hierarchs, honoring the contribution of the three great saints to Orthodoxy and Hellenic Learning.


