

The Transfiguration of our Lord on Mount Tabor


Celebrated on August 6 **Hymn of the Feast**

Apolytikion of the feast (Grave Tone)

You were transfigured on the Mount, Christ God revealing Your glory to Your disciples, insofar as they could comprehend. Illuminate us sinners also with Your everlasting light, through the intercessions of the Theotokos. Giver of light, glory to You.

Commentary:

Our Lord had spoken to His disciples many times not only concerning His Passion, Cross, and Death, but also concerning the coming persecutions and afflictions that they themselves would endure. Since all these evils were near at hand, but the enjoyment of good things which they hoped to receive in their stead was yet to come, our Savior desired to give them full assurance, evidently and openly, concerning that glory which is prepared for those



who endure to the end. Therefore, fulfilling that which He had promised shortly before, that "there be some standing here which shall not taste of death, till they see the Son of man coming in His Kingdom" (Matt. 16:28), He took His three foremost disciples and ascended Mount Tabor, where He was transfigured before them. His face shone like the sun, and His clothes became white as the light. Suddenly, together with this dread and marvelous effulgence of light, there appeared those pinnacles of the Prophets, Moses and Elias, who spoke with the Lord Jesus concerning His saving Passion which was about to take place. Standing before Him as reverent servants, they showed that He is the Lord of both the living and the dead, for Moses came forth from Hades, having died many centuries before, and Elias, as it were from heaven, whither he had been taken up while yet alive. After a little while a radiant cloud overshadowed them and out of the cloud they heard that same voice which had been heard at the Jordan at the Baptism of Christ, testifying to the Divinity of Jesus and saying: "This is My beloved Son, in Whom I am well-pleased; hear ye Him" (Matt. 17: 5).

Such are the marvels, truly worthy of God, celebrated in this present feast, which is an image and prefiguring of the future state of the righteous, whose splendor the Lord spoke of, saying: "Then shall the righteous shine forth as the sun" (Matt. 13:43). It is because of this that the Kontakion of this Feast is said daily (when there is not a great feast) in the Service of the Typica in perpetual commemoration of the glory that will be the lot of the Saints. According to tradition, the Lord's Transfiguration came to pass forty days before His Crucifixion; this is why the Transfiguration is celebrated forty days before the Exaltation of the Cross.

The Dormition of our Most Holy Lady the Theotokos and Ever Virgin Mary

Hymn of the Feast

Apolytikion of the feast First Tone

In giving birth, O Theotokos, you have retained your virginity, and in falling asleep you have not forsaken the world. You who are the Mother of Life have passed over into life, and by your prayers you do deliver our souls from death.

Hymns from the Vespers Service

From the Lity. Tone Plagal of the First Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.


Come, O gathering of those who love to keep the feasts, come and let us form a choir. Come, let us crown the Church with songs, as the Ark of God goes to her rest. From the Aposticha. Fourth Tone.

Come, O ye people, and let us sing the praises of the pure and most holy Virgin, from whom the Word of the Father ineffably came forth incarnate. Let us cry aloud and say: Blessed are you among women and blessed is your womb that held Christ. Having delivered your soul into His holy hands, do you, O most pure, entreat Him for the salvation of our souls.



From the Aposticha.

Tone Plagal of the 4th (by Sergios of the Holy City) Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever and unto ages of ages. Amen.

At your departing, O Virgin Theotokos, to Him who was ineffably born of you, James the first bishop and brother of the Lord was there, and so was Peter, the honored leader and chief of the disciples, and the whole sacred fellowship of the apostles. In discourses that showed forth heavenly things they sang the praises of the divine and amazing mystery of the dispensation of Christ our God; and they rejoiced, O far-famed Virgin, as they buried your body, the origin of the Life and holder of God. On high the most holy and venerable of the angelic powers bowed in wonder before this marvel, and said one to another: 'Open wide your gates and receive her who bore the Creator of heaven and earth. With songs of praise let us glorify her precious and holy body, dwellingplace of the Lord on whom we may not gaze.' Therefore we too, as we keep your feast, cry out to you, O far-famed Lady: Raise up the Christian horn and save our souls.


The Beheading of St. John the Forerunner and Baptist

Celebrated on August 29
Hymn of the Feast

Apolytikion of the feast (Second Tone)

The memory of the just is celebrated with hymns of praise, but the Lord's testimony is sufficient for thee, O Forerunner; for thou hast proved to be truly even more venerable than the Prophets, since thou was granted to baptize in the running waters Him Whom they proclaimed. Wherefore, having contested for the truth, thou didst rejoice to announce the good tidings even to those in Hades: that God hath appeared in the flesh, taking away the sin of the world and granting us great mercy.

Commentary: The divine Baptist, the Prophet born of a Prophet, the seal of all the Prophets and beginning of the Apostles, the mediator between the Old and New Covenants, the voice of one crying in the wilderness, the God-sent Messenger of the incarnate Messiah, the forerunner of Christ's coming into the world (Esaias 40: 3; Mal. 3: 1); who by many miracles was both conceived and born; who was filled with the Holy Spirit while yet in his mother's womb; who came forth like another Elias the



Zealot, whose life in the wilderness and divine zeal for God's Law he imitated: this divine Prophet, after he had preached the baptism of repentance according to God's command; had taught men of low rank and high how they must order their lives; had admonished those whom he baptized and had filled them with the fear of God, teaching them that no one is able to escape the wrath to come if he do not works worthy of repentance; had, through such preaching, prepared their hearts to receive the evangelical teachings of the Savior; and finally, after he had pointed out to the people the very Savior, and said, "Behold the Lamb of God, Which taketh away the sin of the world" (Luke 3:2-18; John 1: 29-36), after all this, John sealed with his own blood the truth of his words and was made a sacred victim for the divine Law at the hands of a transgressor.

This was Herod Antipas, the Tetrarch of Galilee, the son of Herod the Great. This man had a lawful wife, the daughter of Arethas (or Aretas), the King of Arabia (that is, Arabia Petraea, which had the famous Nabatean stone city of Petra as its capital. This is the Aretas mentioned by Saint Paul in II Cor. 11:32). Without any cause, and against every commandment of the Law, he put her away and took to himself Herodias, the wife of his deceased brother Philip, to whom Herodias had borne a daughter, Salome. He would not desist from this unlawful union even when John, the preacher of repentance, the bold and austere accuser of the lawless, censured him and told him, "It is not lawful for thee to have thy brother's wife" (Mark 6: 18). Thus Herod, besides his other unholy acts, added yet this, that he apprehended John and shut him in prison; and perhaps he would have killed him straightway, had he not feared the people, who had extreme reverence for John. Certainly, in the beginning, he himself had great reverence for this just and holy man. But finally, being pierced with the sting of a mad lust for the woman Herodias, he laid his defiled hands on the teacher of purity on the very day he was celebrating his birthday. When Salome, Herodias' daughter, had danced in order to please him and those who were supping with him, he promised her -- with an oath more foolish than any foolishness -- that he would give her anything she asked, even unto the half of his kingdom. And she, consulting with her mother, straightway asked for the head of John the Baptist in a charger. Hence this transgressor of the Law, preferring his lawless oath above the precepts of the Law, fulfilled this godless promise and filled his loathsome banquet with the blood of the Prophet. So it was that that all-venerable head, revered by the Angels, was given as a prize for an abominable dance, and became the plaything of the dissolute daughter of a debauched mother. As for the body of the divine Baptist, it was taken up by his disciples and placed in a tomb (Mark 6: 21 - 29). Concerning the finding of his holy head, see February 24 and May 25.



STEWARDSHIP MINISTRY CORNER - Larry Gess, Chair

For the first time in many years, our parish is trying to adequately finance the various ministries, especially the youth ministries. As a result, the total budgeted income from the parishioners' donations to the General Fund (i.e., stewardship donations) was increased about 8.6% to \$478,500. This means that we all need to donate monthly about \$40,000 collectively to the General Fund if the parish is to meet its 2013 budget. So far, our collective donations have been nearly \$34,400 per month — up slightly from the last STEWARDSHIP MINISTRY CORNER report. Still we are about thirteen percent behind where we should be at mid-June. The primary reason for this gap is that 16% of the parish members have not yet donated anything this year and one-third of the parish members are behind with regard to what they reported they would be donating. If the parish is to implement the ministry programs in the fashion approved by the February Parish Assembly, especially during these summer months when church attendance is low, we kindly urge that each of us do the following as it applies:

- (1) If you have not yet done so, please complete and return a Membership/Stewardship Form as soon as possible;
- (2) If at all possible, please donate monthly at least one-twelfth of what you indicated you will donate to the General Fund so that the parish may meet its obligations; and
- (3) Please donate even more than you planned each month if God's blessing allows you to do so, thereby enabling the parish to fully support its ministries this year and to pay its monthly bills during the summer.

Your expression of love and thanksgiving to God through your unselfish donation of time, talents, and treasures to continue His work here on earth is an essential component of your pathway to eternal salvation.

THE DIVINE LITURGY AND STEWARDSHIP BY LARRY GESS


During the Divine Liturgy, the Priest prays for the precious Gifts. In his very next petition that follows "..., (in) receiving them (the precious gifts)...", the Priest asks that God "...will send down upon us in return His divine grace and the gift of the Holy Spirit..."

The first important stewardship point is that the Priest presents the precious Gifts in behalf of us all – a stewardship act of an offering to God from His bounty to us in thanksgiving to Him. As the result of another stewardship act of offering our time, we are present so God can bestow His grace and the Holy Spirit upon us during the Divine Liturgy.

Beyond continuing to praise and thank God throughout the remainder of the Divine Liturgy, we can do one additional important stewardship act to show God we love Him as well as to acknowledge that He is the continued source of our blessings – we can sacrificially give to His earthly work from our personal treasures when the tray is passed.

During every Divine Liturgy offered to us, it is very important to link all aspects of our stewardship – our time (being present), our talent (joining into the hymns and prayers), and treasures (our gifts for His work) to His Gifts of Grace and the Holy Spirit as we worship and praise Him together. If we would only stop and reflect upon this interrelationship, it would become clear that we all have been blessed by His grace throughout our lives. The Devil and his demons would have made our lives intensely miserable without our God-given protection. Thus let us all rededicate ourselves to offering the stewardship of our time by responding to Christ's invitation to be present during the *Last Supper* each time it is offered.
