Dear friends and parishioners,

We are very blessed because in just twenty five years our parish has been able to accomplish amazing things: We have been able to embrace the local community in more than one way and we have, in return, been embraced by the local community. We have grown in numbers as we reached out and brought into the parish people who, until now, had no idea what Orthodoxy was; we are offering Orthodox worship services, Introduction to Orthodoxy classes, Bible studies and New Testament Greek classes; we have been helping people in their difficult times through the Philoptochos' social services, the Agape Fund and more recently Jacob's Garden; we have been a beacon of culture in the community through our Hellenic Dance and Greek Festival.

Holy Transfiguration has become one of the most respected and honored organizations in Cobb County: I frequently receive the honor and respect for our community, culture and Faith as I am invited to attend public events, speak in schools and other places and offer invocation prayers at the County Commissioners' meetings.

As a result of this progression of our growth and impact on the local community came the need for growth in our ministries and expansion of the space needed for those ministries. That is why for the last three years we have been engaged in a very serious effort to discover what our future needs might be through Strategic Planning Meetings and other studies. We have also been engaged in developing plans for the future and evaluating our ability to accomplish and fulfill the mission of the Parish according to the Great Commission of Christ to bring the Gospel to all nations (Matt. 28:19-20).

In the last three years we have paid off our Sanctuary and other buildings, purchased eight acres of land south of our property, established an Orthodox cemetery, and are now in the process of purchasing an 1.8 acre lot (with a house) to the East of our property.

The time has come to also expand our buildings to create classrooms and athletic spaces, modernize our Parish Life Center and provide better administrative facilities and more parking while setting up also for future growth.

St. Matthew the Apostle and Evangelist ***November 16***

The Holy apostle and evangelist Matthew, who was also called Levi was the son of Alphaeus and had Galilee as his homeland. He was a publican, a tax-collector for Rome, in a time when the Jews were under the rule of the Roman Empire. When Matthew heard the voice of Jesus Christ: “Come, follow Me” (Mt. 9:9), he left everything and followed the Savior. Christ and His disciples did not refuse Matthew’s invitation and visited his home, where they shared a meal with the publican’s friends and acquaintances who, like their host were also publicans and known sinners. The Jews considered tax-collectors pernicious betrayers of their country and religion and to even speak with one was considered a sin, and to associate with one was defilement. But the Jewish leaders were not able to comprehend that the Lord had “not come to call the

righteous, but sinners to repentance.” (Mt. 9:13).

Matthew, acknowledging his sinfulness, repaid fourfold anyone he had cheated, distributed his remaining possessions to the poor, and followed Christ with the other apostles. Matthew was attentive to the instructions of the Savior, beheld His innumerable miracles, and was one of the twelve apostles that went to preach to “the lost sheep of the house of Israel” (Mt. 10:6). He was also a witness to the suffering, death, and Resurrection of the Savior, and of His glorious Ascension into Heaven.

Having received the grace of the Holy Spirit, which descended upon the apostles on the day of Pentecost, Matthew preached in Palestine for several years. At the request of the Jewish converts at Jerusalem, the holy apostle Matthew wrote his gospel, emphasizing Christ as the Incarnate God, inaugurating the kingdom of God and establishing the new covenant with the true Israel, before leaving to preach the Gospel in other lands. He wrote down the Gospel for the first time, in the Aramaic language. Some years later, this book was translated into Greek, but no copy in the original language has survived.

Later, St Matthew traveled to Parthia and the city of Hierapolis (on the Euphrates river) to proclaim the Gospel to the pagans there. One tradition holds that he reposed in peace in that region at a great age. Another tradition holds that he was martyred by a king of that region, who later repented and was baptized, taking the name Matthew. The king then cast down the idols and established the Christian faith in his realm.

Sometimes, he is depicted in icons, with someone in the likeness of a man standing next to him. This is reminiscent of one of the symbolic living creatures mentioned by Ezekiel (1.10), which, as Saint Irenaeus writes, is a symbol of our Savior’s Incarnation of which he reminds us with his continuous reference to Jesus as the “Son of Man” in his Gospel.

Apolytikion in the Third Tone


O Holy Apostle and Evangelist Matthew, intercede to our merciful God,
that He may grant our souls forgiveness of sins.

Kontakion in the Fourth Tone

When you did cast away the publican’s balance and were united to the yoke of uprightness, then you did prove a merchant of great excellence, one that gathered in the wealth of the wisdom of Heaven; for this cause, the word of truth you did herald, O Matthew, and did arouse the souls of sluggish men by signifying the dread day of reckoning.

Andrew the First-Called to be an Apostle

November 30



The Holy Apostle Andrew was the son of Jonas and was from Bethsaida on the shore of Lake Gennesaret. From his youth he turned with all his soul to God, working with his brother as a fisherman. Andrew first left his fisherman's trade to become a disciple of St John the Baptist. St John the Baptist said to Andrew and John the Theologian, "Behold the Lamb of God!", at this, both disciples followed after Jesus. After conversing with Christ, Andrew hurried home and told his brother Simon Peter, "We have found the Messiah." For being the first to recognize Jesus as the Christ, St Andrew is called the First-Called.

After the Descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, Apostle Andrew went to Eastern lands preaching the Word of God. He traveled around the Black Sea and in Thrace and Macedonia, traveling as far as Lazica in the Caucasus.

On his journeys the First-Called Apostle endured many sufferings and torments from pagans: they cast him out of their cities and they beat him. In Sinope they pelted him with stones, but remaining unharmed, the persistent disciple of Christ continued to preach to people about the Savior. Through the prayers of the Apostle, the Lord worked many miracles. By the labors of the holy Apostle Andrew, Christian Churches were established, for which he provided bishops and clergy.

The final city to which the Apostle came was the city of Patras of Achaia, where the Lord worked many miracles through His disciple. The infirm were made whole, and the blind received their sight. Through the prayers of the Apostle, the illustrious citizen Sosios recovered from serious illness; he healed Maximilla, wife of the governor of Patras and his brother Stratokles. The miracles accomplished by the Apostle and his fiery speech enlightened almost all the citizens of the city of Patras with the true Faith.

A few pagans, however, remained at Patras, including the prefect of the city, Aegeatos. The Apostle Andrew repeatedly turned to him with the words of the Gospel. But even the miracles of the Apostle did not convince Aegeatos. The angry Aegeatos gave orders to crucify the apostle thinking he might undo St Andrew's preaching if he were to put him to death on the cross.

St Andrew the First-Called accepted the decision of the prefect with joy and with prayer to the Lord, and went willingly to the place of execution. He was crucified head downwards on a cross in the shape of an "X", the first letter of Christ in Greek. The holy Apostle rejoiced at being allowed to suffer the same death as his Master and the X shaped cross has become a symbol for the Apostle.

Apolytikion in the Fourth Tone


As first of the apostles to be called, O Andrew, brother of him (Peter) who was foremost,
beseech the Master of all to grant the world peace and our souls great mercy.

Kontakion in the Second Tone

Let us praise the namesake of bravery, the divinely eloquent and first to be called of the Disciples of Christ, the kinsman of Peter. As he called out to him in the days of old, so now he calls to us, "Come, we have found Him for whom we yearned."





We offer ourselves and all creation to the Lord at every Divine Liturgy with the words, "*Your Gifts, of what is Yours, we offer unto You.*" We acknowledge that everything we offer to God is a gift from Him. We take what God has given to us and we return it to Him as an act of our thanksgiving and praise.

As stewards of God's gifts, we return to Him a portion of our time, talents and treasures for Christ's work on earth through His Church.

The Christian Stewardship Program is an opportunity to respond to Christ's love by perpetuating His ministry through the Church. Stewardship places the responsibility to support the Church exactly where it belongs, on us. Let us offer then from the goods He has given us back to Him: "*Your Gifts, of what is Yours, we offer unto You.*"

How much should I offer to the Church in order to support the work of God?

Proportionate giving: This involves two things; Firstly, that our level of giving rises out of our level of income. Secondly, that our giving is an offer of thanksgiving for His blessings.

We should ask ourselves "what is a worthy level for my Stewardship?" The Bible gives much guidance by teaching us that direct giving to God and His work should be proportionate to our income, wealth and possessions. Each person is to give according to his or her own ability.

The Old Testament laid down the standard by asking for a percentage of one's income. This provides for us the principle that giving should be in proportion to our income. Each Steward should determine what percentage of his or her income will be committed to Christ and the Church for the current year.

We should consider what we spend on cable television, holidays, pets, dining out, sports events, vacations and so on. How do these expenses compare with our giving for God's work?

We should ask ourselves if our Stewardship Commitment is serious and responsible before God. Is our gift a genuine response to the Lord: "*Your Gifts, of what is Yours, we offer unto You.*"?

Offer your Stewardship each Sunday. Family members over 18 years of age, who are employed, should make their own Stewardship Commitment.

Participation in the Christian Stewardship Program allows each Greek Orthodox Steward to vote and to seek elective office in the administration of the parish as provided in the Archdiocesan and Parish By-laws. If you are not a Steward, you are not eligible to vote or be voted into office.

THE CHURCH CUPBOARD

Thank you to all who participated in the “*Reverse Offering*” by buying and returning groceries for distribution to families in the Trickum Road community. Our Parish provided over one hundred full bags of non-perishable food which were divided between thirteen families. Over fifty children received specially planned and varied breakfasts, lunches and dinners which would feed the entire family for at least one week. The families were selected by Ms. Kim Evans, the Cobb County School Resource Coordinator for three local elementary schools and Simpson Middle.

Because of loyal Parish support of *Jacob’s Garden*, the sale of vegetables this summer allowed for enough money to also provide each family one or two gallons of fresh milk, loaves of fresh bread and sliced ham and turkey sandwich meat. So many vegetables were picked the week before that the families were able to choose bags of bell peppers, squash, tomatoes, beans and greens.

While the mothers walked and talked with our Parish volunteers who filled the push carts, the children came into the PLC and were treated to cookies and lemonade. A very special thanks to Emily Miltiades for chaperoning for many hours all these visiting children. Emily made the kids feel at home, kept the snacks flowing and answered a lot of questions like: “What kind of Church is this?” “Are you a Greek?” One little guy, on noticing the mosaic icon of Christ in the exo-narthex, turned to Emily and asked: “Does Jesus live in there?” “Yes He does”, said Emily.

Currently, we plan to make Reverse offerings three times each year, in January, June and October. This distribution to the families occurred on Friday and Saturday, the second week of October. 
