


Directions to our Parish:

Fr. Panapiotis' Message





Change, some times, seems to be a good thing; we change schools, we change neighborhoods, we change towns, we change states, we change cars, we change doctors, we even change political parties. Change can be a renewal in some ways and is welcome.

When it comes to the Faith, however, the moral issues and family values, and the foundational positions of life handed down to us through the centuries, change may not be the best course for us.

Let me use an image from our lives: Redecorating our house, painting it a new color, moving the furniture around, getting a new couch, fixing the yard and redoing the landscaping are all welcome changes that refresh and renew our space and may re-invigorate our lives in various ways. No one in their right mind, however, will dig into the foundation

of the house or meddle with the structural beams of the building just for the sake of change. There are some things you do not touch, for the structure will come down crumbling on your head.

The Faith and the spiritual/moral aspects of our life are the foundation and structural supports of humanity. It has taken the very humbling of God Himself and his presence on earth for these things to be revealed to us fully. In addition, two thousand years of application and testing of these principles in the lives of Orthodox Christians, since then, has shown their great value for us both on the personal as well as the societal level.

Unfortunately, in our times, certain people removed from God, immersed in their passions and confused about the essence of life, have been meddling with those things that we Orthodox have held precious over the centuries; the doctrines of the Faith (the divinity of Christ and the resurrection) have been under severe scrutiny and outright mockery for decades by the so called "intellectuals" of our time. Marriage has been under attack as a principle and institution leading to a tremendous increase in broken families with dire spiritual, moral and psychological consequences for millions of people (both spouses and children). Unbridled sexuality and the idolatry of the flesh have been paraded even in our own living-rooms in the guise of entertainment as the norm of life, while virginity, purity of body and soul have been mocked and ridiculed as backward and not normal. The family, as a core institution of our society, is being pushed to the brink of destruction by new norms, relationships and ideas offering a false feeling of personal freedom and independence.

The question arises bigger than life: What is it that we as Orthodox Christians can do?

The answer: Resist the winds of change!!! The Orthodox Church has survived the decadence of the Roman society and conquered it, establishing a Christian Empire and an Orthodox Christian culture that lasted over a thousand years, because it refused to go along with the norms of their time. It survived fourteen centuries of subjugation to the muslims and decades of abuse by the communists because it held fast to the Faith in Christ's divine power and the hope of the resurrection through Him.

This is our call today as American Orthodox Christians: We need to hold fast to the principles of Faith and life as handed down through the centuries to us and *resist the winds of change!!!*


Holy Protection of the Theotokos

October 1st

Troparion (Tone 4)

Most holy Mother of God, today we Orthodox joyfully celebrate thy coming among us. As we gaze at thy icon we cry with compunction: Shelter us under thy protection, deliver us from evil, and pray thy Son Christ our God to save our souls.

On October 1, 911, at 4 AM, the Mother of God appeared above the people in the crowded Blachernae Church of the Mother of God in Constantinople, during an all night vigil. She had in her outstretched hands a long veil. St. Andrew the Fool for Christ was standing in the back. He said to his disciple Epiphanius, "Do you see how the Queen and Lady of all is praying for the whole world?" Epiphanius replied, "Yes, Father; I see it and stand in dread." They are depicted in the lower right of this icon. This reminds us of how the Theotokos intercedes for those who ask in time of distress. St. Romanos the Melodist is depicted on the lower left holding a scroll with words from the Canon of the Nativity where he wrote: "Today the Virgin gives birth." We see St. John the Baptist and



other Saints in heaven giving glory to the Theotokos, as well.



STUDY: Couples That Pray Together Stay Together



Family Worship

Couples that share similar religious beliefs and pray together in their home are more likely to experience greater happiness in both marriage and live-in relationships, a new study released Tuesday found. And African-American couples are more likely (40 percent) than non-Hispanic whites and Hispanics (both 29 percent) to have a partner that shares religious beliefs. "White couples, in general, reported greater relationship satisfaction than other groups, presumably because of income and educational advantages," the *Washington Post* reported. "But the racial gap lessens when religious similarities come into the mix."

The study, described as the first major look at religion and relationship quality across racial lines, will appear in this month's issue of the *Journal of Marriage and Family*. "What this study suggests is that religion is one of the key factors narrowing the racial divide in relationship quality in the United States," said study co- author W. Bradford Wilcox, director of the National Marriage Project at the University of Virginia. **Just as shared religious beliefs and experiences can enhance a relationship, conflicting beliefs or practices can harm one.** The study found relationship satisfaction to be lower when only one half of a couple regularly attended religious services.

Interpol warns of global attacks if Quran is burned

Lyon (France), Sep 9 (AFP)

The global police agency Interpol warned today that if a US church group makes good on a threat to burn copies of the Quran it will probably trigger terrorist attacks around the world.

Interpol Secretary General Ronald Noble said he had warned member states that "if the proposed Quran burning ... goes ahead as planned, there is a strong likelihood that violent attacks on innocent people would follow.

"Although there are currently no specific details as to what forms of terror attacks would follow, what is clear is -- if the Quran burning goes ahead as planned -- there will be tragic consequences," he said in a statement.

Grand ayatollah in Iran warns U.S. of repercussions if Quran burned

TEHRAN - Grand Ayatollah Lotfollah Safi Golpayegani has warned the United States that there will be major repercussions if the plan to burn the Quran on the 9/11 anniversary is carried out.

Ayatollah Golpayegani issued a statement on Wednesday, saying he, along with 1.5 billion Muslims, as well as other truly civilized people in the world, denounce the barbarous plan.

He stated that such a plan will endanger all of humanity and will give rise to major disturbances.

"I warn... Christian leaders that if such a catastrophic and inhuman incident takes place in the United States, we will hold the U.S. government and President Obama accountable," he said.

Most Americans are perplexed by this phenomenon: How can Muslims be willing to go to such extremes for the burning of a book?

Here is some interesting info to help clarify this better:

- 1. To Muslims, the Quran is the incarnate Word of God. Not just a divinely inspired book, but the very Word of God embodied in the book. Pretty much, the Quran is to the Muslims what Jesus Christ himself is to the Christians. (This is the case in spite the fact that Jesus (Isa) is also called the Word of God and Messiah in the Quran 4.171). Hence, whatever is in the Quran is a direct command for all true Muslims to follow. God speaks directly and definitively to them and the whole world through this book.
- 2. Mohammed is the other source of faith for Muslims. His life and teachings are important especially because of the ambivalence of the Quran on certain subjects. The Quran came from his hands and he is first and prime interpreter of it. Muslims are predisposed to honor Mohammed as the *per exellence* Prophet and Apostle of God and the epitome of human perfection in character, words and deeds. He is the role model that all Muslims are obligated to emulate.
- 3. To disrespect Mohammed and/or the Quran is the ultimate blaspheme against God Himself and is punishable by death. The death sentence can be enacted on Muslims and non-Muslims alike.

In the understanding of Muslims, killing of the unbelievers and sinners is sanctioned by God Himself thought the Quran in certain cases. Here are a few verses from the Quran where killing of those opposed to the Muslim faith and/or His Apostle and Prophet (Mohammed), and/or who refuse to submit to the authority of Islam and the teachings of Mohammed and the Quran is endorsed and authorized by God Himself through His Word (the Quran).

Quotes from the Quran authorizing killing (note verse 5:33 especially):

- [9.5] So when the sacred months have passed away, then slay the idolaters wherever you find them, and take them captives and besiege them and lie in wait for them in every ambush . . .
- [2.191] And kill them wherever you find them, and drive them out from whence they drove you out, and persecution is severer than slaughter, and do not fight with them at the Sacred Mosque until they fight with you in it, but if they do fight you, then slay them; such is the recompense of the unbelievers.
- [4.89] They desire that you should disbelieve as they have disbelieved, so that you might be (all) alike; therefore take not from among them friends until they fly (their homes) in Allah's way; but if they turn back, then seize them and kill them wherever you find them, and take not from among them a friend or a helper.
- [4.91] You will find others who desire that they should be safe from you and secure from their own people; as often as they are sent back to the mischief they get thrown into it headlong; therefore if they do not withdraw from you, and (do not) offer you peace and restrain their hands, then seize them and **kill** them wherever you find them; and against these We have given you a clear authority.
- [5.33] The **punishment** of those who wage war against Allah and His apostle and strive to make mischief in the land is only this, that they should be murdered or crucified or their hands and their feet should be cut off on opposite sides or they should be imprisoned; this shall be as a disgrace for them in this world, and in the hereafter they shall have a grievous chastisement
- [9.14] Fight them, Allah will **punish** them by your hands and bring them to disgrace, and assist you against them and heal the hearts of a believing people.

The Authority and example of Mohammed from the "Hadiths"

The "Hadiths" are sacred writings containing information about the life and teachings of Mohammed. Here are examples from the "Hadiths", which are used by the Muslim leaders (in the context of Sharia Law) in order to make decisions when faced with the issue of punishment of those who abandon the Muslim faith or act in inappropriate ways:

Punishment of Disbelievers at War with Allah and His Apostle

Volume 8, Book 82, Number 794:

Narrated Anas:

Some people from the tribe of 'Ukl came to the Prophet and embraced Islam. The climate of Medina did not suit them, so the Prophet ordered them to go to the (herd of milch) camels of charity and to drink, their milk and urine (as a medicine). They did so, and after they had recovered from their ailment (became healthy) they turned renegades (reverted from Islam) and killed the shepherd of the camels and took the camels away. The Prophet sent (some people) in their pursuit and so they were (caught and) brought, and the Prophets ordered that their hands and legs should be cut off and that their eyes should be branded with heated pieces of iron, and that their cut hands and legs should not be cauterized, till they die.

Punishment of adulterers by Mohammed himself

Volume 8. Book 82. Number 806:

Narrated Abu Huraira:

A man came to Allah's Apostle while he was in the mosque, and he called him, saying, "O Allah's Apostle! I have committed illegal sexual intercourse." The Prophet turned his face to the other side, but that man repeated his statement four times, and after he bore witness against himself four times, the Prophet called him, saying, "Are you mad?" The man said, "No." The Prophet said, "Are you married?" The man said, "Yes." Then the Prophet said, 'Take him away and stone him to death." Jabir bin 'Abdullah said: I was among the ones who participated in stoning him and we stoned him at the Musalla. When the stones troubled him, he fled, but we over took him at Al-Harra and stoned him to death.

Volume 8, Book 82, Number 813:

Narrated Ibn 'Abbas:

When Ma'iz bin Malik came to the Prophet (in order to confess), the Prophet said to him, "Probably you have only kissed (the lady), or winked, or looked at her?" He said, "No, O Allah's Apostle!" The Prophet said, using no euphemism, "Did you have sexual intercourse with her?" The narrator added: At that, (i.e. after his confession) the Prophet ordered that he be stoned (to death).
