



Fr. Panayiotis' Message

Taking Inventory of our Investments

Every day that goes by is either an opportunity lost or an opportunity we have taken seriously and benefited from.

Spiritual giants of the Orthodox Faith have always advised that at the end of every day we should take inventory of what we have done with our lives. We should be ready at any moment, so that if God were to call us in, we would be able to give "a good account of ourselves before the awesome judgement seat of Christ."

The same applies with regard to our families and also our Parish. We need to stop occasionally and take inventory of our accomplishments, but also of our failures. I assume, we already do that with our material accomplishments; we check our holdings, we repair our homes and other buildings, we make sure our investments are in good hands and are yielding profits. We try to secure the future of our children by purchasing insurance, investing in various ways and saving for their education and subsequent needs, so that they may never find themselves in want. We even hire experienced people (at a substantial cost) who help us make those decisions as to how we may invest wisely.

The question arises: What about our spiritual life? What about our spiritual investments? Are we even making any investments at all? What about the spiritual state of our children? Are we securing their spiritual future in any way? And the more difficult question of all is, how will we be able to accomplish this? How can we secure our children from the possible spiritual "market crash" of the future? And finally, who can help us make these important decisions?

I would like to offer three short answers to the above: First, we need to begin a serious effort to connect with God in prayer on a daily and even hourly basis. This is the most valuable investment we can ever make. God's strength, wisdom and other gifts will only come to us through prayer. Just showing up for church on a Sunday (whenever we can!) will not cut it. Second, with regard to our children, we need to instill in them "faith security"; we need to anchor them in the Orthodox Faith in such ways that they will never even consider an alternative place to be. Third, we need to seek out the experienced people, the "elders" of the Church, the spiritual fathers, who will guide us in our quest for His Kingdom, who will teach us how to pray, who will help us make the best possible investment of our time on this earth.

And they will not even charge us anything. It is all free!

Saint John Chrysostomos

rthe Golden Mouth

Celebrated On November 13

Saint John Chrysostomos, Archbishop of Constantinople, one of the Three Hierarchs [Comm. 30 January], was born at Antioch in about the year 347 into the family of a military-commander. His father, Secundus, died soon after his birth. His mother, Anthusa, widowed at twenty years of age, did not seek to remarry but rather devoted all her efforts to the raising of her son in the dictates of Christian piety. The youth studied under the finest philosophers and rhetoricians. But, scorning the vain disciplines of pagan knowledge, he turned himself to the profound study of Holy Scripture and prayerful contemplation. Saint Meletios, Bishop of Antioch (Comm. 12 February), loved John like a son, guided him in the

faith, and in the year 367 baptized him. After three years John was made a church-reader. Later on, he began to study under the experienced instructors of ascetic life, the presbyters Flavian and Diodore of Tarsus. After his mother's death, John entered the monastic life, which he called the "true philosophy" "the angelic life". He lived as an ascetic in the caves overlooking Antioch for two years dedicating himself to the study of the scriptures and prayer, but had to return to the city on account of his health.

In the year 381 the bishop of Antioch Saint Meletios ordained young John a deacon. The years following were devoted to organizing the philanthropic efforts of the Church of Antioch. The widows and the orphans were his main concern, while he also embarked on his major writings and commentaries of the Bible.

In the year 386 Saint John was ordained presbyter by the bishop of Antioch Flavian and was given the duty to preach the Word of God. Saint John was a splendid preacher, which eventually gained him the title the "Golden-Mouth" (Grk. "Chrysostomos"). For twelve years he preached in church amidst a crowded throng of people, deeply stirring the hearts of his listeners, usually twice a week, but sometimes daily.

Most of his sermons, still extant, are works of commentaries on entire books of the Bible (Genesis, the Psalter, the Gospels of Matthew and John, the Epistles of the Apostle Paul). Saint John as presbyter zealously promoted the care for the needy: under him the Antioch Church each day provided sustenance to as many as 3,000 orphans and widows, as well as the shut-ins, wanderers and the sick.

The fame of the golden-mouthed preacher grew, and in the year 397, he was summoned from Antioch, against his will and the will of his flock, to become the Archbishop of Constantinople. At the capital, he was not able to preach as often as he had at Antioch. Many other matters awaited to be resolved, and he began with the most important -- the spiritual perfection of the priesthood. And in this he himself was the best example. His love for the poor, however, was not lessened; the financial means apportioned for the archbishop were channelled by the saint into the upkeep of several hospices for the sick and two hostels for pilgrims. He himself sufficed on scant food, and refused invitations to public banquets. The zeal of the saint in affirming the Christian faith spread not only to the inhabitants of Constantinople, but also to Thrace -- to include Slavs and Goths, and to Asia Minor and the Pontine region. He established a bishop for the Bosphorus Church, situated in the Crimea. Saint John sent off zealous missionaries to Phoenicia, to Persia, and to the Skyths, to convert pagans to Christ. He also wrote missives to Syria to bring back the Marcionites into the Church, and was able to accomplish this.

Preserving the oneness of the Church, the saint would not permit a powerful Gothic military-commander, who was dictating terms to the emperor, to open an Arian church at Constantinople. He also left an indelible mark on the Liturgical Life of the Church reflected in the Divine Liturgy bearing his name. He also introduced antiphonal singing for the all-night vigil, and wrote several prayers for the sacramental rite of anointing the sick with oil.

The dissolute morals of people in the capital, especially at the imperial court, found in the person of the saintly hierarch its denunciation. When the empress Eudoxia connived at the confiscation of the last properties of the widow and children of a disgraced dignitary, the saint rose to their defense. The arrogant empress did not concede and nursed a grudge against the saintly bishop. The hatred of Eudoxia against the him blazed forth anew, when malefactors told her, that apparently the saint had her particularly in mind in his instruction on women of vanity.

An enraged empress connived again to have the Archbishop removed. In this she found support from disgruntled clergymen, that Chrysostom had disciplined in the past.

This court of judgement declared Saint John deposed. The emperor Arcadius, urged by his wife Eudoxia, signed the order for the banishment of the Archbishop.

At the church surged an angry crowd, resolved to defend their pastor. The saint, in order to avoid a riot, gave himself over into the hands of the authorities. That very night at Constantinople there occurred an earthquake. The court was shuddered. The terrified Eudoxia urgently besought the emperor to bring back the saint and promptly dispatched a letter to the banished pastor, beseeching him to return. And anew, in the capital church, the saint in a short talk praised the Lord, "For All His Ways". The slanderers fled to Alexandria. But already after a mere two months a new sermon by the archbishop provoked the wrath of Eudoxia.

In March of the year 404 a new council brought together by the empress decided again the exile of Saint John. Reluctantly, the emperor Arcadius gave in to the wrath of his wife. The archbishop, once again, was on his way to exile escorted by soldiers in the middle of the night. The next morning, as the news of his banishment spread through the capital, riots broke out. A conflagration reduced to ashes the temple of Saint Sophia and the Senate edifice. Devastating barbarian incursions soon followed, and on October 6th 404 the young and proud empress Eudoxia died a sudden death. Four young children wept at the bier of their unfortunate mother. Even pagans saw in these events Heavenly chastisement for the unjust judgement rendered against the saint of God.

In the meantime, the saint was banished to the area of Caucasus Armenia. He had to endure the trip on foot, despite his weak health. From his exile in Armenia, he strove all the more to encourage his spiritual children. In numerous letters (245 are preserved) to bishops in Asia, Africa, Europe and particularly to his friends in Constantinople, Saint John consoled the suffering, guiding and giving support to his followers. In the Winter of 406 his health was failing and he was confined to his bed with sickness. But his enemies were not to be appeased.

From the capital came new orders to transfer Saint John to desolate Pityus (in Abkhazia) at the foot of the Caucasus. Worn out by sickness, under accompanying military escort and traveling on foot for three months in the rain and frost, the saint made his final transferral, -- at Comana his powers failed him. On the 14th of September 407, at the crypt of Saint Basiliskos (Comm. 22 May), comforted by a vision of the martyr ("Despair not, brother John! Tomorrow we shall be together"), and having communed the Holy Mysteries, the Ecumenical hierarch with the words, "Glory be to God for all things! Amen", surrendered his soul to the Lord, whom he so much loved and served. He was buried there in Comana until his holy relics were solemnly transferred to Constantinople in the year 438. His memory was set by the Church to be commemorated not on September 14, the day of his death, but on November 13, so that it may not be overshadowed by the great feast of the Elevation of the Holy Cross.

On January 27, 438, Constantinople was overtaken by a religious fervor. Their late Patriarch John was to be returned to the Imperial seat and given his due honors. He was to be received as a martyr and a saint. He had been declared the Golden Mouth of the Church (Chrysostomos). Half of the city were one their knees. Today a spiritual conqueror was making his entrance. Justice had finally prevailed. The exiled was coming home.

Emperor Theodosius II, son of Eudoxia and Arcadius, urged by his pious sister Pulcheria and the new Patriarch Proclus, had given the command for the relics of the saint, banished by his parents, to be transfered from his far-off tomb in Pontus to the Imperial city of Constantinople and be given a burial with honors of a martyr and saint in the Church of the Holy Apostles next to other Patriarchs and saints.

The people of Constantinople paid their respects to a man who stood larger than life both in life and in death.

WHAT IS STEWARDSHIP?



We offer ourselves and all creation to the Lord at every Divine Liturgy with the words, "Your own gifts, of Your own, we offer to You." We acknowledge that everything we offer to God is a gift from Him. We take what God has given to us and we return it to Him as an act of our thanksgiving and praise.

As stewards of God's gifts, we return to Him a portion of our time, talents and treasures for Christ's work on earth through His Church.

The Christian Stewardship Program is an opportunity to respond to Christ's love by perpetuating His ministry through the Church. Stewardship places the responsibility to support the Church exactly where it belongs, on us. Let us offer then from the goods He has given us back to Him: "Your own gifts, of Your own, we offer to You."

Our Church needs our financial support. Let us offer from the gifts God has given us.

How much should I offer to the Church in order to support the work of God?

Proportionate giving involves two things. Firstly, that our level of giving rises out of our level of income. Secondly, that giving out of thanks will involve sharing a portion of that income for God's work.

We should ask ourselves "what is a worthy level to determine my Stewardship?" The Bible gives much guidance by teaching us that direct giving to God and His work should be proportionate to our income, wealth and possessions. Each person is to give according to his or her own ability.

The Old Testament laid down the standard by asking for a percentage of one's income. This provides for us the principle that giving should be in proportion to our income. Each Steward should determine what percentage of his or her income will be committed to Christ and the Church for 2005.

We should consider what we spend on cable television, holidays, pets, dining out, sports events, vacations and so on. How do these compare with our giving for God's work?

We should ask ourselves if our Stewardship Commitment is serious and responsible before God. Is our gift a genuine response to the Lord: "Your own gifts, from Your own gifts, we offer unto you?"

Offer your Stewardship each Sunday. Family members over 18 years of age, who are employed, should make their own Stewardship Commitment.

Participation in the Christian Stewardship Program allows each Greek Orthodox Steward to vote and to seek elective office in the administration of the parish as provided in the Archdiocesan and Parish Bylaws.

ORTHODOX CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP



Christian Stewardship is a life-style, which acknowledges accountability and responsibility before God. Becoming a Steward begins when we say we believe in God, to whom we give our love, loyalty and trust. We affirm that every aspect of our lives comes as a gift from Him. Stewards are motivated as recipients of God's abundant love, to respond by participating and supporting His plan of salvation and the ministries of the Church, which make salvation possible for them and for others.

In the Bible, the Steward is depicted as a person who is given the responsibility of managing something that belongs to the Owner, God. The Steward as the manager is thus accountable to the Owner for all that he possesses and is responsible to return to the Lord his or her fair share in gratitude and thanksgiving. As God has been generous to us, He expects us to be generous toward the work of Christ and His Church. Our Stewardship Commitment is the tool of ministry, salvation and healing for us and for others. Christian Stewardship is the privilege and honor of directly supporting God's work on earth through the Church.

A flourishing parish Christian Stewardship Program can be compared to a river, which overflows into many tributaries and reaches out in many directions to share with others our rich and profound spiritual inheritance. Success on the local level emanates to greater support and outreach on all levels of ministry: local, national and international. Christian Stewardship offers each person the means to become an active proponent in disseminating the Orthodox Faith through fair and generous giving to support the Parish, Metropolis and Archdiocesan or National Ministries.

"On the first day of every week, each of you is to put something aside and store it up, as he may prosper, so that contributions need not be made when I come." (1 Corinthians 16:2)

Saint Paul instructed the Corinthians to offer their support for the Church of Jerusalem on a regular and consistent schedule.

Our Parish has been operating on the Stewardship System for a number of years. We would like all of our parishioners to understand that the success of the work of the Church is dependent upon them and fully participate in Stewardship. God has endowed all of us with many gifts. We are now called to offer back to Him in proportion to what He has given us. We are asked to offer back from our Time, Talent and Treasure, each according to the extend of our blessings. If we have more time we must give more in time, if we have a special talent we should give of our talent and if have been blessed more with treasure we should give back from our treasure.

All the Ministries of the Parish, the Metropolis and the Archdiocese depend upon our Stewardship. Let's fulfill our responsibility toward God, our Church and our fellow men. Let us offer back to God from the Gifts He has given us!
