



A NEW YEAR - A NEW OPPORTUNITY



Many new nears' ago Jesus said this parable:

"A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard; and he came seeking fruit on it and found none. And he said to the vinedresser, `Lo, these three years I have come seeking fruit on this fig tree, and I find none.

Cut it down; why should it use up the ground?' And he answered him, `Let it alone, sir, this year also, till I dig about it and put on manure. And if it bears fruit next year, well and good; but if not, you can cut it down."' (Luke 13:6-9)

We as a parish are a fig tree planted by the Lord. Each one of us, as members of the parish, are branches of this fig tree receiving nourishment from the Holy Spirit. This new year offers us the opportunity to fulfill the desire of the Lord for us to present to Him the spiritual fruits of our lives. He has blessed us with so much. He expects us to bear the Fruits of the Holy Spirit, Love, Joy, Peace, Long-

suffering, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness, Self-control (Gal. 5:22). He expects us to shine with His light to the world around us who is in darkness.

Let's make an extra effort this year to read a spiritual book and challenge our minds to love God more. Let's take advantage of confession to wash away the filth from our souls. This year we need to approach Holy Communion with the "fear of God, faith and love" after proper preparation so that we may truly taste of the Kingdom of God.

Let us live this new year as if it were our last one on this earth, so the Lord may bless it and grant us many more years filled with the fruits of the Spirit.



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A Lenten Meditation




"Repent, for the Kingdom of God is at hand." With these words our Lord began His earthly ministry, in order to show how important this act of repentance is for the person who is looking for a higher meaning in his life. Repentance means cleansing of one's self from all evil thoughts, desires and habits. Repentance means reconciliation with one's brother and sister. It means sitting down and honestly examining one's self critically; it means a complete change of mind and life (µɛтɑ́voiɑ).

But one could still ask: "Why do I have to do all this?": Because there is only one higher meaning in life. One that goes beyond the beauty of art, the ecstasy of music, the joy of intellectual achievement. It goes beyond earthly power or human honor. It transcends the desire for a happy family life and a respectful social status. It reaches high into the heavens and touches God. There is no meaning to life if this life is not infiltrated by the

presence of the power, the joy, the strength and above all the love generated from the source of all life, God Himself.

You may ask: "How can I have that?": Cleanse yourself! Repent! Change your life! Recommit yourself - your whole being - to God daily. Ask Him to unite Himself to you. Call out to Him, cry out with all your heart asking for His Holy Spirit to come and dwell in you. Then, you will grasp the fullness of life, not just the meaning of it.



ON JANUARY 6, WE CELEBRATE THE GREAT FEAST OF THEOPHANY OR EPIPHANY, ONE OF THE MAJOR HOLY DAYS OF THE ORTHODOX CHURCH. IT WAS ON THIS DAY THAT CHRIST APPEARED BEFORE JOHN THE BAPTIST AT THE RIVER JORDAN AND ASKED TO BE BAPTIZED BY JOHN. DURING HIS BAPTISM THE HEAVENS OPENED AND GOD WAS REVEALED AS TRINITY. THEOPHANY MEANS THE APPEARANCE OF GOD. SIMILARLY, EPIPHANY MEANS THE APPEARANCE. THIS FEAST IS ALSO CALLED THE FEAST OF LIGHTS BECAUSE THE DIVINE LIGHT SHINES INTO THE WORLD WITH THE COMING OF THE LORD.

A FEW DAYS AGO (CHRISTMAS) WE SAW CHRIST AS A NEW BORN BABE. TODAY (THEOPHANY) WE SEE HIM A FULL GROWN MAN OF 30 BEGINNING HIS MINISTRY AMONG THE PEOPLE. GOD WHO SHONE FORTH FROM THE VIRGIN SHINES TO DAY FORTH INTO THE WORLD TO BEGIN HIS MINISTRY.

TODAY THE SMALL ENTRANCE OF THE DIVINE LITURGY IS EXPANDED INTO A FULL CELEBRATION. IN THE PROCESSION OF COMING FORTH FROM THE HOLY ALTAR CARRYING THE GOSPEL ALOFT, THE PRIEST REPRESENTS CHRIST COMING FORTH INTO THE WORLD TO BRING THE GOSPEL TO ALL PEOPLE. THE SMALL ENTRANCE OF THE DIVINE LITURGY IS IN REALITY A SMALL EPIPHANY OF THE LORD.

AT THE CONCLUSION OF THE LITURGY ON THEOPHANY THE PRIEST WILL PERFORM THE SPECIAL SERVICE OF THE BLESSING OF THE

THEOPHANY OR EPIPHANY THE FEAST OF LIGHTS (TA PHOTA)

WATERS. TODAY HE WILL BLESS THE WATER SO THAT, IN THE WORDS OF THE PRAYER:

"THOSE WHO POUR AND PARTAKE THEREOF (OF THE HOLY WATER) MAY RECEIVE IT FOR THE CLEANSING OF SOULS AND BODIES, FOR THE HEALING OF SUFFERING, FOR SANCTIFICATION OF HOMES AND FOR EVERY NEED."

WHEN LEAVING THE CHURCH WE SHALL ALL TAKE A BOTTLE OF THIS HOLY WATER WITH US TO BLESS OURSELVES AND OUR HOMES. IN SOME PARTS OF THE COUNTRY, BISHOPS THROW A CROSS INTO THE SEA, OR A RIVER, TO BE RETRIEVED BY A SWIMMER. IN THIS WAY THEY BLESS THE WATERS, PRAYING FOR THOSE WHO TRAVEL THROUGH THEM TO BE PROTECTED.


CHILDREN SHOULD BE ENCOURAGED TO KEEP A SMALL BOTTLE OF HOLY WATER AND PLACE IT NEXT TO THEIR ICON AND USE IT THE YEAR ROUND. THEY CAN PARTAKE OF THE HOLY WATER WITH A SPOON IN THE MORNING BEFORE THEY EAT AT ANY TIME OF THE YEAR WHEN THEY FEEL THAT THEY HAVE A SPECIAL NEED FOR THE LORD'S PRESENCE IN THEIR LIVES. THUS, THEY WILL KEEP EPIPHANY THE YEAR ROUND.

THIS FEAST IS REMEMBERED BY SOME OF THE WESTERN CHRISTIANS AS THE VISITATION OF THE MAGI. THIS WAS PROBABLY THE EMPHASIS GIVEN TO THE DAY IN THE WESTERN CHURCH FROM EARLIER TIMES.

Feast of the Three Hierarchs - Celebration of Hellenic Learning

In 11th century Constantinople every conversation turned to the same controversy: Which of the three 4th-century saints was the greatest in the Orthodox church? Was it St. Basil the Great, the beloved spiritual leader who created orphanages and hospitals and left a legacy of great spiritual and theological writings in the finest form of the Greek language? Was it St. Gregory the Theologian, whose leadership kept the church together during a time of theological crisis and also contributed beautiful works of poetry and prose to the literary corpus of Hellenic learning? Or was is St. John Chrysostom, the wonderful speaker who had "a mouth of gold" and left behind a great legacy of writings in the Hellenic tongue which parallel the great philosophers and rhetoricians of classical times? In 1081, Bishop John of Galatia had a vision in which the three saints appeared to him telling him that they were equal in the eyes of God. The church set aside a day to commemorate their equality. Since then, Hellenes around the world have celebrated this day as the holiday of the Three Hierarchs, honoring the contribution of the three great saints to Orthodoxy and Hellenic Learning.

The Orthodox Church has preserved the original Apostolic Faith pure and unblemished. The Orthodox Church did not experience a reformation or counter reformation because the Faith was kept untouched by time and people. That does not mean all Orthodox people are always perfect, but that the Faith has remained perfect.

If the Orthodox Church in America is to succeed in its primary mission to bring the Gospel of Salvation and Sanctification to the world--we must continually return to the core Faith, to the prime theological teachings of the divinity of Christ and the salvation offered through Him.

We also need to establish our own schools where we will cultivate in our children the Orthodox Christian principles of life as the early Christians did. We cannot shape souls effectively unless we undertake a serious effort of immersion of our people from a young age in the Faith and Orthodox way of life. A serious Christian education is the way to do that. An Orthodox Christian education in particular is the only way to counter the intellectual onslaught of the secular society upon the minds of our people.

For years, as immigrants (Greeks, Russians, Serbs and others), we sought to establish ourselves as a respectable minority in America. We have succeeded and surpassed most other minorities. We now stand at a crossroads: we either continue to seek further political and societal acceptance through the use of the wealth God has given us, or we turn our focus to the greatest treasure we have, the ORTHODOX FAITH, and find ways to effectively share it with those around us.

We can either use our wealth to further impress the secular world with our successes so that we can continue to gain their respect and recognition, or we can seek ways to present the treasure of ancient Christianity that has been handed down to us by creating opportunities for theological education for those around us, especially those who are looking for authentic Christian teaching. Do we become anchored citizens of this world through our secular successes, or do we cultivate our citizenship in heaven through a witness of authentic Christian life?

This is a critical moment in the life of our Parish, as well. We have established ourselves by the grace of God as a respectable "faith group" in this corner of the earth. People are now ready to listen to us if we do have a serious message to offer. But we need to first understand what this message really is and make it an integral part of our own lives. As a group of people who claim to be followers of Christ, we need to begin living according to His teaching. People around us have to recognize us from our love for each other and our good works. We need to make a mark in the local community as both philanthropists as well as lovers of God. Then we will be able to make a difference in American Society, not through monetary wealth, but rather through the Wealth of the Orthodox Faith and Traditions that we have inherited.

Let's become Ambassadors of Orthodox Christianity, the Ancient Faith, the Faith of the Apostles!

The Practice of "Confession" In the Bible




