


Directions to our Parish:

fasting - A Personal Ascesis

On Monday, February 19 we enter the period of Great Lent, the Great Fast. This is always a challenging time for many people, especially those who have not seriously tried to fast in the past. Many people, faced with this challenge ask the question: Is fasting necessary? The practice of fasting is indeed a most ancient one. The most profound example of fasting in the Old Testament was that of Moses as he ascended Mount Sinai purifying his body, soul and mind in order to be able to meet God and converse with Him: "He was there with the LORD forty days and forty nights; he neither ate bread nor drank water". (Exod. 34:28) As he ascended the mountain he left behind every worldly care. When he returned to the Jewish people bearing the plaques of the Ten Commandments inscribed by the finger of God he was filled with the Glory of God. His face was shining like the sun and the people could not

even look at him (Exod. 34:29ff). This came about as Moses reached the ultimate state of purification (Catharsis) which allowed him to become a dwelling place of the Uncreated Light of God. Fasting was an essential personal ascesis leading to this purification. His desire to talk with God led him to do it. This is the main reason for which we need to fast, as well! It's a personal effort with the goal of connecting with God intimately. As we fast thinking of God's Love and praying to Him, He is present in our lives. The New Testament period began with a man who lived on locusts and wild honey, St. John the Baptist (Matt. 3:4; Mark 1:6). St. John embraced this personal discipline, transforming himself to serve as a witness to the Messiah. Our fasting can make us also witnesses of God's love.

Finally, the practice of fasting was sanctioned by our Lord Jesus Christ Himself, when He fasted for forty days in the desert before he embarked on His earthly ministry; He began His fight against the devil (Matt. 4:2) with a strict form of fasting accompanied by prayer. Through our personal fasting we may also defeat the devil and his temptations. Christ is always there to help us.

The ultimate goal of fasting is to help us keep the commandments of God. It is a form of spiritual training or askesis, which helps us acquire spiritual discipline. Fasting helps us detach ourselves from the earthly pleasures of the flesh. It helps us discipline our desires and take control of our passions. By managing to control what goes into our mouth and stomach we train ourselves to be able to control what comes out of our mouth and heart. Through the discipline of fasting we may also become able to control our eyes and avoid looking at things which will aggravate our passions and desires further. Fasting will also enable us to control our fleshly desires, our anger and jealousy and above all our pride.

According to St. John Chrysostom, fasting is to the soul what food is to the body. In the same way as material food nourishes the body, so also fasting strengthens the soul and makes its wings lighter and able to move more easily; fasting helps lift the soul above this world and bring her to communicate uninhibited with the Creator, having freed her from her attachment to the pleasures and lusts of this life. Fasting, however, should always be accompanied by (i) Prayer, (ii) Repentance for our sins, (iii) Forgiveness of others, (iv) Reading of the Bible and other spiritual books and (v) Almsgiving.

Let's try it again this year. We can only gain from it! Let us keep the fast as much as each one is able!



MAR AN HORE

A Lenten Meditation



"Repent, for the Kingdom of God is at hand." With these words our Lord began His earthly ministry, in order to show how important this act of repentance is for the person who is looking for a higher meaning in his life. Repentance means cleansing of one's self from all evil thoughts, desires and habits. Repentance means reconciliation with one's brother and sister. It means sitting down and honestly examining one's self critically; it means a complete change of mind and life (µɛтɑ́voiɑ).

But one could still ask: "Why do I have to do all this?": Because there is only one higher meaning in life. One that goes beyond the beauty of art, the ecstasy of music, the joy of intellectual achievement. It goes beyond earthly power or human honor. It transcends the desire for a happy family life and a respectful social status. It reaches high into the heavens and touches God. There is no meaning to life if this life is not infiltrated by the

presence of the power, the joy, the strength and above all the love generated from the source of all life, God Himself.

You may ask: "How can I have that?": Cleanse yourself! Repent! Change your life! Recommit yourself - your whole being - to God daily. Ask Him to unite Himself to you. Call out to Him, cry out with all your heart asking for His Holy Spirit to come and dwell in you. Then, you will grasp the fullness of life, not just the meaning of it.

Entering the Great Fast - Great Lent

"The arena of virtues is open. Let all who are willing to compete enter, girding themselves. For those who genuinely compete will be deservedly crowned. Let us do battle with the enemy. Let us take on the armor of the Cross, having Faith as an invincible rampart, prayer as our breastplate, and charity as our helmet."

Fasting through the centuries:

All the righteous before Christ fasted. Fasting was precursory to meeting with God or to a revelation. Moses climbed up Mount Sinai after forty days of noneating and then spoke with God. The New Testament is not at all different, it begins with a fastener - John the Baptist. Even Christ Himself fasted for forty days before beginning His earthly ministry.

All the holy men and women of the church fasted on a regular basis. Christians have been fasting for the last 2,000 years. We fast every Wednesday remembering the betrayal of Christ and every Friday remembering His crucifixion. We fast during Great Lent, the Lent of Christmas and the Lent of August. By doing so we honor Christ and also exercise control over our passions.

The Practice of "Confession" In the Bible

Greet everyone with "CHRIST IS RISEN!" & say it before good morning and goodnight!



RAISING CHILDREN IN TODAY'S SOCIETY

Fr. Panayiotis's "Recipe" of Orthodox Christian parenthood

Child bearing/rearing is one of the most noble of privileges we received from God: We have become co-creators with Him and we have the opportunity to shape the souls of our children and offer them back to God.

Through marriage we learn how to love and be loved, how to sacrifice, how to be patience, how to be humble, how to control our own urges and place the other person's needs ahead of our own.

But by having children we also complete ourselves in the image of God as Trinity. We learn how to come out of ourselves (the conditional love of the two) and learn to love the third (our children) in an unconditional way. This sharing of love is in the image of the love shared by the three persons of the Holy Trinity, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

Shaping our children spiritually:

We need to teach our children how to exercise self-control, how to moderate their own urges and take control over their passions.

We need to teach them the value of truthfulness, honesty, keeping of the commandments of God, chastity and purity, honor and respect. We need to help them be humble and not egotistical; help them overcome their self-centeredness and become social human beings.

We need to establish boundaries for our children so that they may learn to recognize and avoid excesses.

We need to teach them to see themselves as Temples of the Holy Spirit, so that they may treat their bodies with respect and reverence and avoid actions that will defile and desecrate this Holy Temple of their soul and body.

Prayer, fasting, Confession, almsgiving, regular attendance of church worship and participation in the Holy Sacraments (with Holy Communion at the center) are necessary ascetic practices for the building up of their souls and the establishment of their spiritual and mystical experiences with God.

The children copy us, their parents. We are the primary role models for them. We must not behave in ways we want them not to.

Finally:

Let's surrender our children to the hands of God every day in our prayers. They are His gift to us. Let's offer them back in prayer every day, asking that He may guide and protect them always.

May the Grace of our Lord Jesus Christ guide us and strengthen us to always do our best.

A full immersion for the whole week in these services will have a transformational effect on the young people in particular. These blessed experiences will enhance the possibilities that our children will stay close to the Church and retain their Faith as they are confronted by the challenges of the world.

I cannot emphasize enough how critical it is that we focus our children on Holy Week this year.

Hence, as you begin your planning for the next school break, please keep these thoughts in your mind.

May the Grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the Love of God the Father and the Communion of the Holy Spirit be with you today and always.



THE ROLE OF STEWARDSHIP IN PARISH MANAGEMENT

Each Orthodox parish is part of the Body of Christ, the Universal Church, thus every parish belongs to God and tries to lead its members to the Kingdom of God. However, the collective membership of each parish has the ability to decide the direction of their parish on this earth. They typically exercise their collective authority through their votes in the election of the Parish Council members and the decisions of the Parish Assemblies. The Parish Assembly decisions include the approval of the Local Parish By-Laws and their amendments, the purchase and sale of property, the approval of contracts to build and maintain facilities, the approval of annual budgets, and other similar actions which impact the daily life and future of the parish.

Every parish is headed by a duly ordained Orthodox Priest, whose role is to oversee and nurture the life of the parish for the spiritual development of its members while he serves as a father, spiritual leader and vessel of the Holy Spirit to impart the Grace of God on His people. The priest and the parish are under the authority of the local Orthodox bishop, in our case the Metropolitan of Atlanta, who is the teacher and keeper of the Holy Orthodox Faith and Traditions. All major decisions of the Parish Assembly have to be approved by the local bishop. The parish priest, as the direct representative of the Metropolitan at the parish, guides the parish away from actions that are counter to Holy Tradition and the Regulations of the Archdiocese.

The role of the Parish Council with the Parish Priest is the daily management of the parish in a fashion that reflects the Holy Traditions, Archdiocese Regulations, and, very importantly, the direction that has been decided by the collective parish membership – both for the current year and historically. Thus each Parish Council member is required to continually acquire knowledge and be mindful of the Holy Traditions, the Archdiocese Regulations, and the current and historical actions of the Parish Assembly.

Every Orthodox faithful has a responsibility to assist in making the parish management process effective on an ongoing basis. *First and foremost, each faithful person in the parish must annually renew his/hers active membership in the parish by completing and returning the annual Stewardship Form.* The Parish Council cannot effectively plan an annual budget, nor can it effectively manage the parish's expenses without the fiscal input reflected on each member's annual Stewardship Card – this is particularly true with regard to the youth ministries. Also, the Parish Council and the ministry leaders cannot effectively implement the parish ministries without the volunteering of members' time and talent that is also reflected on the Stewardship Forms. The second important responsibility of the parishioners in the management of the parish is their participation in the Parish Assemblies and the election of Parish Council members. Finally, the degree of success of the parish depends largely upon the extent to which the members unselfishly donate their time, talent, and treasure (money) towards the operation and development of the parish. The more we donate, the sooner we will realize our collective dreams for our parish.



As stewards of God's gifts, we return to Him a portion of our time, talents and treasures so that Christ's work on earth might be accomplished through His Church.





The **Philoptochos Panagia chapter** started off the new year with about 60 members joining for 2018 at the annual membership luncheon. President Pat Koutouzis read a letter from the Greek Orthodox priest expressing his appreciation to the Holy Transfiguration community and Philoptochos for the generous donation of \$3,375, which was collected during the month of December. The book was originally published in 1992, but the new edition will include the family's journey to Orthodoxy. All proceeds from the sale of the book will be donated to the Orthodox Christian Prison Ministry and Angel Tree, a ministry directed to children of incarcerated parents. More information will be in available in the next few weeks.



THREE HIERARCHS @ GREEK LETTERS EVENT



The Feast of the Three Hierarchs and Hellenic learning:

The Great theologians and preachers of Christianity from the 4th century, Basil the Great, Gregory the Theologian and John Chrysostom, stand out as the people who provided a transition from the pagan flavor of Classical Education to the Christian synthesis between Classical learning and the Gospel. Being themselves immersed in Classical Education, they were able to show the world how the writings of the ancient philosophers were filled with the Logos of God (Jesus Christ). These great thinkers were able to provide a way to look at the Classical writings of the ancient Greek Philosophers as precursors of the teaching of Christ in the Greek speaking world. They were able to show how this prepared the way for the Christianization of the Greek speaking and Classically trained peoples of their time. This was a major achievement brought about by the work of the Holy Spirit. Their contemporary (and classmate of Basil and Gregory, prince Julian the apostate) who became emperor, tried to stop the advancement of this synthesis of Classical learning with Christianity by forbidding Christians from teaching during his tenure as Emperor. Upon the death of Julian, however, Christianity proceeded to adopt the tools of Classical learning for the sake of the promotion of the Gospel. The Empire was soon converted to the Christian Faith.



We were honored this year to have with us the Consul of Greece in Atlanta Mr. Emmanouil Androulakis for the celebration of the Three Hierarchs and Greek Letters who gave a beautiful and informative speech. The honorary Consul of Cyprus Ms Polly Potter was also present.


Our Parish owns a large selection of burial plots, which we are making available to our parishioners at a price of \$3,200.00, which includes one plot and a vault.
