Directions to our Parish:



ARE YOU INVOLVED IN THE MINISTRIES OF OUR PARISH?



Our Parish has thirty different ministries. Are you involved in any of them? And if you are, what do you expect to get from that?

Since we are a church, the goal of the parish is to help us grow spiritually and guide us to enter the Kingdom of God.

If you are involved in a ministry, any of the ministries of our parish, is that ministry or ministries helping you to grow spiritually? Do you feel that your participation in those particular ministries will help you enter the Kingdom of God?

This is a serious challenge for our ministry leaders: Is your particular ministry helping the participants in a spiritual way?

I ask this of myself every day. Are people who speak with me, those who encounter me and spend time with me, benefitting spiritually from my work, from my words, from my presence in their lives? If they are not, I am certainly wasting my time and my energy, as well as theirs.

In a parallel manner, the ministries of the parish that do not benefit the participants in a spiritual way are a waste of effort and resources.

There is, however, a qualification to this; every social gathering that is building and enhancing healthy relationships and is not causing people to sin is a good thing by itself. Healthy relationships, where Christian love is shared, can be the beginning of spiritual growth.

Hence, I will challenge all of us, members of this parish, leaders and participants, to examine everything we are doing from this perspective. We need to make sure that we are providing a healthy, spiritual environment for the development of all into members of God's Kingdom, even in the here and now, by doing everything with God at the center. Let's begin all activities with a prayer, offering thanks to God for His many blessings that He has bestowed upon us. The leaders of ministries, let's pray for God's Grace to come upon our ministries and enhance spiritually what we are trying to do. The participants, let's pray for God's Will for all of us. Prayer is a source of divine energy that transforms all things from secular to spiritual.

The parish is the Ark of Salvation in the midst of a tumultuous world, an ever changing society. It is a safe haven from the tempest-tossed sea of life. All protection and peace comes from God. If we don't make Him the center of our lives in every way invoking His help in prayer, we will miss out on His Gifts.

Dear friends and parishioners,

The wisdom granted to us by God through the Holy Scriptures and the writings and admonitions of the holy fathers of Christianity in the past two thousand years is a precious treasure trove to dig into and find guidance to strengthen everything you are trying to accomplish. 


St. Olympias the Deaconess - July 25

St. Olympias was born in 361 AD into a wealthy family of high ranking in the Christian Roman Empire (probably in Constantinople). Her father was the senator Anicius Secundus and through her mother, Alexandroka, she was the granddaughter of the noted eparch Eulalios.

When Olympias was still very young, her parents betrothed her to a nobleman. The marriage was supposed to take place when Olympias reached the age of maturity. However, the bridegroom died before the wedding took place, and Olympias did not wish to enter into another marriage, preferring a life of virginity.

After the death of her parents, Olympias inherited great wealth. She then began to distribute this wealth to the poor and needy, the orphaned and the widowed. She was also very generous with her donations to the



churches, monasteries, hospices, and shelters for the homeless. She established a hospital and a shelter for young orphaned girls and undertook their care and education. She also established a monastery for women where she resided, as well. All of her wealth was put to work for the benefit and comfort of the poor of Constantinople.

Because of her many philanthropic activities, she was appointed a deaconess by the holy Patriarch Nektarios (381-397). She would provide great assistance to the hierarchs of Constantinople as well as the visiting bishops from many places.

She became especially close to St. John Chrysostom, who was elevated to Archbishop of Constantinople on February 26 of 398. St. Chrysostom had high regard for Olympias and showed her goodwill and spiritual love. When Chrysostom was unjustly banished in 404 AD, Olympias and the other deaconesses (Pentadia, Proklia, and Salbina) were deeply upset. Eventually, Olympias was sent to exile because of her devotion to St. Chrysostom's innocence. St. John Chrysostom wrote to her several letters from his exile, consoling her in her sorrow.

St. John Chrysostom reposed on September 14, 407. Almost a year later, St. Olympias died in exile as well after a long illness somewhere in Nicomedia on July 25, 408. Shortly before her death, Olympias gave instructions that her remains be placed in a coffin and tossed into the sea, leaving her final resting place to divine providence. Her coffin was washed on the shores of Constantinople and she was interned in the Church of the Holy Apostle Thomas. Later her holy relics were brought to the monastery which she had established. Many miracles and healings occurred from her relics.

The Orthodox Church has preserved the original Apostolic Faith pure and unblemished. The Orthodox Church did not experience a reformation or counter reformation because the Faith was kept untouched by time and people. That does not mean all Orthodox people are always perfect, but that the Faith has remained perfect.

If the Orthodox Church in America is to succeed in its primary mission to bring the Gospel of Salvation and Sanctification to the world--we must continually return to the core Faith, to the prime theological teachings of the divinity of Christ and the salvation offered through Him.

We also need to establish our own schools where we will cultivate in our children the Orthodox Christian principles of life as the early Christians did. We cannot shape souls effectively unless we undertake a serious effort of immersion of our people from a young age in the Faith and Orthodox way of life. A serious Christian education is the way to do that. An Orthodox Christian education in particular is the only way to counter the intellectual onslaught of the secular society upon the minds of our people.

For years, as immigrants (Greeks, Russians, Serbs and others), we sought to establish ourselves as a respectable minority in America. We have succeeded and surpassed most other minorities. We now stand at a crossroads: we either continue to seek further political and societal acceptance through the use of the wealth God has given us, or we turn our focus to the greatest treasure we have, the ORTHODOX FAITH, and find ways to effectively share it with those around us.

We can either use our wealth to further impress the secular world with our successes so that we can continue to gain their respect and recognition, or we can seek ways to present the treasure of ancient Christianity that has been handed down to us by creating opportunities for theological education for those around us, especially those who are looking for authentic Christian teaching. Do we become anchored citizens of this world through our secular successes, or do we cultivate our citizenship in heaven through a witness of authentic Christian life?

This is a critical moment in the life of our Parish, as well. We have established ourselves by the grace of God as a respectable "faith group" in this corner of the earth. People are now ready to listen to us if we do have a serious message to offer. But we need to first understand what this message really is and make it an integral part of our own lives. As a group of people who claim to be followers of Christ, we need to begin living according to His teaching. People around us have to recognize us from our love for each other and our good works. We need to make a mark in the local community as both philanthropists as well as lovers of God. Then we will be able to make a difference in American Society, not through monetary wealth, but rather through the Wealth of the Orthodox Faith and Traditions that we have inherited.

Let's become Ambassadors of Orthodox Christianity, the Ancient Faith, the Faith of the Apostles!


What is Christianity!

In 2018, we have received <u>330</u> pledges. Thank you to the families who have submitted their 2018 Membership/Stewardship Pledge.





HOLY TRANSFIGURATION GARDEN


