




Directions to our Parish:

Fr. Panayiotis' Message

February 2019



What is the value of the Parish to us?

I have, from time to time, wondered how my parishioners look at our parish, what they expect from it, but also what they are willing to bring to it. Each of us has a wealth of gifts to offer, but we also have many needs.

I know that many people like to join a parish in order to have a social group to belong to. Many, also, are looking for the cultural aspects of a parish, in addition to the social. And, yet, many people come to a parish as they also seek to fill the emptiness of the heart which has to do with our yearning for God's presence in our lives.

Knowing all of these aspects of human needs and yearnings, we, here at Holy Transfiguration, have sought to provide for everyone as much as possible in order to win as many as possible.

This parish is a very welcoming group of people who embrace everyone. It is easy to become part of the social life of the group, as long as you are willing to apply a little effort. It takes two to tango, as we say!

As far as culture, our parish has a wide range of activities and ministries, which provide a multitude of opportunities for involvement and enjoyment, from food events, to dance opportunities, to theatrical performances, to the biggest party in Cobb County and the surroundings - the Marietta Greek Festival.

We have ministries for our children ranging from Summer Camp, HOPE/JOY, GOYA, St. Stephen's Camp, Winter Youth Rally, and HDF to so many other activities. We offer so much for our children, including not only volunteer advisors but also a young educated and capable priest dedicated to organizing and overseeing the youth activities. We are so blessed to welcome into our parish Fr. Michael Tishel, who will be in charge of our youth ministries starting February 1, 2019.

But the parish also provides opportunities to extend ourselves outwards and help people in the surrounding community who are less fortunate than we are. We do this for one through the ministries of the Philoptochos. The ladies of this group visit the sick and shut-ins, provide help for those who need help with rent and utilities and even provide personally help with people who need a ride to the doctor, the grocery story or a special appointment.

In the last couple of years we have also developed the Food Pantry, which is now helping many families with food and other needs twice a month.

More than 30 people have also participated in the last two years with helping build homes for needy families through the "Habitat for Humanity". The joy we receive from these activities is indescribable!

Many families in our parish also find support through the Agape Fund, a ministry funded by our parishioners for the benefit of our needy parishioners. This is serving both adults and children, providing funds in a confidential way to families, as well as scholarships for needy youth to attend the Winter Youth Rally, HDF, St. Stephen's Camp, Crossroad and other activities.

Above all, however, our parish provides for all of us the beautiful sanctuary and chapel where we hold regular worship services. Here is where the Kingdom of God is made manifest us, inviting us to enter and be sanctified in the here and now. This is where we are able to surrender to the love of the crucified and risen Lord Jesus Christ so that we can find comfort in our own predicaments and hope in His promise for eternal life. This is where we can fill our desire for God and experience His Presence and Love.

Join us friends, to partake this amazing parish and fulfill your yearnings of every kind. Come and enjoy with us friendship and culture, philanthropy and mission, worship and sanctification. Come taste of the Kingdom of God on earth!

And let us give thanks to God for all things, again and again!

Dear Parishioners,

With the start of the new year comes a new Parish Council to serve our Parish in 2019. Please welcome our new members – Dennis Christopher, Christopher Hansard, Casey Pater, Steve Tingas and Danny Vlahiotis, three of whom are returning from 2018 (Dennis, Steve and Danny). Those three and Christopher were elected in November to serve 3-year terms. Casey was subsequently selected by the Parish Council to replace Zack Kollias, who has resigned from the Parish Council due to a major job promotion. Casey is returning to the Parish Council and will serve Zack's remaining two years of his current term. And, thank you to the outgoing members – Zack Kollias and Paul Markley – for their service to the Parish over the past several years. They will be very difficult to replace.

The new Parish Council has met, elected its officers, and assigned ministry responsibilities for 2019, as shown below. Note that we now have two Vice Presidents in 2019 in order to share responsibilities. Ellen will concentrate on Operations issues, while Mike will be involved with Financial matters.

In other developments, our Saint Philothei Pantry, has now assisted over 50 families since its inception just 16 months ago. The need in the community is so severe that the Pantry will soon begin distributing food twice per month - so look for more reverse offering and volunteer opportunities. Thank you to all the volunteers and donors that have made this ministry a resounding success, especially John and Isabelle Dymond, who have led this ministry for the past year and a half.

The financial acumen of those serving on the Finance committee is enabling us to operate comfortably and solve financial issues that arise, including the refinancing of our current building debt of \$4.5 million. Under the direction of Georgia O'Brien and Danny Vlahiotis, we were able to close on the new loan with Fidelity Bank on January 24. This move fixed the interest rate associated with two-thirds of our debt at 4.65% APR and put the church in a position to have a very manageable debt service in 3-4 years.

Our youth groups are thriving. Under the leadership of Maria Comsudes, our HOPE and JOY kids are involved in many fun and spiritually enriching activities. They recently had a fun event at a local trampoline park and are gathering for monthly Fellowship Fridays. They are also planning a Parents' Night Out, bake sale, etc. for the Spring. Hazel Bruce is again heading up our Summer Camp. Catechism has a full teaching staff of at least two teachers per classroom. The second of two annual teacher workshops is coming up in February. We have 200 registered students, of which 160 are active. Our average weekly attendance is relatively low, however, with an average attendance of 80 students. Parents, we need to do better in getting our children to Sunday School.

Congratulations to our Winter Youth Rally (WYR) participants this year. I have heard only positive things about our children's behavior and performance in the Bible Bowl, Basketball and Volleyball tournaments. In fact, we brought home a 3rd Place Trophy in the Bible Bowl, 2nd Place Trophies in the Senior and Junior Divisions of the Boys' Basketball tournament, and a repeat 1st Place Trophy in the Girls' Division in Basketball. We have such great kids in our community, with a wonderful combination of physical and scholastic skills.

We are also reminded during this stewardship season of the talented parishioners within our church family. Dennis Koutouzis' technical and mechanical skills come to light every day in solving facilities issues that arise. The dance group, under the direction of Paulina Vastakis, Dorian Bafas and many others, just recently performed at HDF (Hellenic Dance Festival) and is now preparing to perform at the Marietta Greek Festival in May. We now have 145 dancers in the group – amazing! Parishioners also help out in the church office, serve on the Parish Council, help cook for events, volunteer for the Festival, lead ministries, and on and on. Our catechism teachers, under the long-time direction of David Linebaugh, give of both their time and talent every week to help lead our youth in the right spiritual direction. And, who can forget Ellen Linebaugh's casting and direction of the Philoptochos' mystery dinner theater production of *Lights, Camera, Murder* starring several Holy Transfiguration parishioners. The talent was impressive. The list of examples of those that share their time and talents for the good of the church goes on forever. I could not possibly name all who donate their time and talent.

In my opinion, however, our greatest blessing at this time is the addition of Fr. Michael Tishel as our second Priest. Father Michael and his Presvytera Catherine (yes, another Presvytera Catherine), his daughter Zoey and son Isaac, arrived from Boston on January 24th. Fr. Michael will officially begin serving our community on Feb 1st. I have spent a couple of hours with Fr. Michael and his family and am as excited about the future of our clergy as I have been in quite some time.

When the Parish Council decided, in September 2018, to pursue a second Priest to fill the void left by Fr. Paul's departure, we expected the search to take between 9 months to two years. Father Panayiotis visited Hellenic College-Holy Cross in October and interviewed several candidates. While there, Fr. Panayiotis met also with Fr. Michael to continue previous discussions related to Fr. Panayiotis' published research on St. John Chrysostom. While together, the opening at Holy Transfiguration randomly came up. As it turns out, the timing was right for Fr. Michael to join a parish and the rest is history. We were very lucky. Budgeting will be impacted of course, as we did not plan on having a second priest until at least mid-2019, but we are confident the parish will step up.

Fr. Michael comes to Holy Transfiguration from Hellenic College Holy Cross, where he served as Director of the Crossroad Program and Assistant Director of the Office of Vocation Ministry (OVM). Fr. Michael holds a Masters Degree from the University of Thessaloniki and was ordained a Priest in May, 2018. I urge you to get to know Father Michael at your first opportunity.

As you can see, there is a lot of exciting activity at Holy Transfiguration. I have only mentioned a small sampling. And, as you know, we are in the middle of our 2019 Stewardship campaign. At this time of the year, we are reminded of how much our community is blessed with parishioners with the time, talent and treasure to give to the church. I have cited several examples of our parishioners' sharing of their time and talent for the good of the Parish. Yet, we are struggling to fill volunteer positions for this year's pre-Festival preparations. In fact, we are at the point where we are considering purchasing all the food for this year's Festival, as there has been a disturbing trend in the last couple of years of volunteer shortages on cooking days. This would, unfortunately, change the public perception of our Festival – one of home-cooked meals, … But, with the lack of volunteers to lead the cooking efforts and do the cooking, we may have no choice.

Now, the dreaded topic of financial donations to the church (Treasure). We have many stewards who give from the heart. We also have parishioners that follow the Bible's directive to give thanks for their financial blessings through tithing. However, most parishioners do not. There are many factors that come into play in determining a family's ability to give to the church. I'm not asking everyone to give 10% of their income, but I do ask that you do your best to maximize your pledge of treasure to the church to support the ministries we are trying to build, expand and improve. Our operating expenses go up every year. They will especially go up this year, as we are boosting support of our ministries and are welcoming a new priest at the same time. We need to keep in mind that everything we have from a material standpoint is a blessing from God. And, please remember that you may give financially via our VANCO app on our website, from your phone or computer. Please call Danny Vlahiotis for assistance.

You are a Member of the Church! Are you a Steward also?

A question always asked by our parishioners is "How can I be a member of the Parish? I am already an Orthodox Christian. Isn't that enough?

The answer to this is very simple: All people baptized and chrismated (confirmed) in the Orthodox Church are automatically members of the Church, but it takes a little more to be "members in good standing" in the Orthodox Church and in the Parish. First, it is required that a person be married in the Church and live their life as an Orthodox Christian, participating in the Holy Sacraments, in order to be in good standing within the Orthodox Church. If one has been married outside the Orthodox Church or has gone through a civil divorce and has not obtained a Church divorce may not be in good standing with the Church. Please check with the priest of the parish in order to find out where you are.

How can one be a member of the Parish?

It takes participation in the parish by supporting the operation and ministries of the parish to be a member in good standing. In order to do that, you have to fill out the Membership/Stewardship Form and indicate on it how you are going to participate in the Parish with your Time, Talents and Treasure. When you join the Parish in this way you make a Pledge to God that you will support the work of the Church with the gifts He has given you so that the Gospel may be preached and people may be saved through the ministries of the Church. **Please join us at Holy Transfiguration and serve God with us!**

ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS FREQUENTLY ASKED ABOUT PARISH MEMBERSHIP AND STEWARDSHIP

Why should I complete a Membership/Stewardship Form?

•When we were baptized, promises were made to serve Christ as our Lord and King for our entire life – So if you have not since rejected Him, you are still pledged to serve Him with your life and there is no better way to do so than serve His Church, His parish where His work is done.

•To show Him that you love Him and thank Him for your abundant blessings, there is no better way to respond than complete the Membership/Stewardship Form and indicate what you pledge to Him throughout the year. This is a way to recommit your life to God every year.

Why do we have to complete a Membership/Stewardship (M/S) Form every year?

•The Archdiocese Regulations requires us to do so in order to be in "Good Standing".

•The Parish's needs change from one year to the next, so it is good for both parish and for us that we re-examine our commitment to the Universal Church (Christ's Living Body on earth) each year. By filling out a new form, we re-commit our gifts as per the needs of the Parish and the Church.

•We provide accurate information about us and/or our families each year for the Parish records.



Better Hear and Understand Our Services

Are you experiencing difficulty understanding what is being said during services or during events in the Parish Hall?

We have two systems installed to assist you to better hear and understand what is being said. The systems are installed under the pews in Church and under the carpet in the Parish Hall. They work when the audio systems are in use and you are sitting in the pews or in the Parish Hall.

There are two ways you can take advantage of these hearing assist systems.

1. Use your existing personal hearing aid with the "T" coil feature turned on.

or

2. Use a receiver device available for your use.

Your audiologist can assist you in making sure your hearing aid has the "T" coil feature, and it is turned on. Most hearing aids today have a "T" coil option; however, not all have this feature.

If you would like to use a hearing device, please see a Parish Council member or a Greeter. There are only a few of these devices available for use during services and events, and they must be returned after use.

A hearing assist device can also be purchased at a cost of \$80 per unit. Please see Anne in the parish office.


Of Water and the Spirit:

In this study of the Orthodox understanding of Christian initiation, the rites of baptism and chrismation, Fr Schmemann invites us to 'rediscover' our own baptism. He penetrates the Church's rubrics and rituals and reveals the message of man's entrance into the new life provided by Christ, into the Church and into God's Kingdom. The result is a powerful statement of the meaning baptism should hold in our lives.

The Fear of Love

Each morning, I receive an e-mail from The Very Rev. Abbot Tryphon of All-Merciful Saviour Monastery on Vashon Island, Washington. Abbot Tryphon pens a daily blog called "The Morning Offering", which is hosted online by Ancient Faith Ministries. Perhaps you know of it.

Recently, he wrote about the fear of committing to long-term relationships, the fear of loss, and why it is essential to grieve the loss of a relationship. Abbot Tryphon writes: "When you refuse to be vulnerable by giving yourself over to a committed relationship, you deprive yourself of one of the most fundamental aspects of what it means to be human. When you fear loss, you are hard pressed to live a life of courage, for it is in living with courage that we are able to fully participate in life and become fully human." I believe this is true not



only for our human relationships, but also for our relationship with our Lord, Jesus Christ.

Later in his post, he explains the importance of grieving: "Grieving the loss of a relationship, either by death or breakup, is just as important to the maturation of our heart, as having a long-term relationship, for in grieving we allow ourselves to stay connected to others and remain openhearted to what God has for us. If fear of loss disables us, we may not be able to risk having anything that really matters to us, for by throwing courage to the side, we deprive ourselves of the touch and the intimacy that helps us open our hearts to all that God has in store for us."

"Grieving is the way you can heal from loss, and, in turn, be open to relationships that can make your life more complete, and more fulfilled. Many people do not allow themselves to grieve, so they deprive themselves of relationships that can lead to spiritual growth that only comes through suffering loss. You grow stronger if you allow yourself to grieve when you've experienced loss, for grieving is one of the most fundamental of life skills. It is the way that the heart can heal from loss and go on to love again and grow wise. If we refuse to love another, for fear of loss, we remain closed off from not only others, but from God. 'He who does not love remains in death (1 John 3:14).'"

Peggy Dunkerly, Asteria (2nd & 3rd Grade) Instructor

Peggy and her family moved from Wisconsin in 1989, and were blessed to be one of the founding families of Holy Transfiguration. The church was just beginning, with no programs in place for our parish children. After seeing the dancers at the Atlanta Festival, she was determined to see that our children be given the same opportunity to enhance their Orthodox faith and culture through a quality dance program. So in 1991, with no dance experience, except the usual dances done at weddings, she joined Troupe Hellas at the Cathedral, leading to the start of our dance ministry.

Peggy danced with Troupe Hellas and the Lykion Ton Ellenidon for 12 years. One of the biggest highlights of her life was performing with them in the Opening and Closing Ceremonies of the 1996 Atlanta Olympics. During her 12 years as Dance Director for HT (1991 – 2003), Peggy was blessed with being with so many amazing children, teaching them how our faith and culture are intertwined. Highlights include winning Gold at the first HDF,

performing in Disney World, marching in the 1996 Paralympics Opening Ceremonies, participating in Epiphany in Tarpon Springs, and attending many professional dance workshops, to name a few.

Recently, Peggy has worked with both Eleni Bafas and Karen Fox with the younger groups. She and Karen took our community's youngest group to HDF this year where they received a Bronze medal. We were very blessed to have such a dedicated group of girls.

Karen's love and passion for traditional Greek music and dance started at an early age, listening to old Greek records back in the 1950's with her family and relatives, and participating in various church and Greek cultural events in New Jersey and Massachusetts. She moved to Atlanta in 1979. Karen was a member of the Lykeion Ton Ellinidon and Troupe Hellas in Atlanta and danced with the adult group in the early 1990's. It was at this time that Karen helped organize the Marietta dance ministry with Peggy Dunkerly and Pitsa Johnson with the guidance of Eleni Hopes, director of Troupe Hellas.

The Marietta dancers, including Karen's children, Melissa and Zachary, performed in the early days at the Cobb Civic Center when the festival was held there before our current church was built. Karen was an instructor for all the age groups for over 10 years. Many of our current HTGOC dance instructors were taught by Karen and Peggy when they were youngsters. Karen and Peggy were responsible for the Marietta dance group participating in many exciting venues, including the Opening and Closing Ceremonies of the 1996 Atlanta Olympic Games, the Opening Ceremonies of the 1996 Atlanta

Paralympic Games, the Egleston Christmas Parade, the Festival of Trees, in addition to a Hellenic cultural video exhibit at the Atlanta History Center. Karen stepped down as an instructor for several years but returned to teach the Pitsirikia group with her daughter, Melissa, in 2015. In 2017, she started to teach the Asteria group with Peggy. Karen also taught a weekly non-performance adult dance class for the members of HTGOC for several years in the 1990s, and most recently started a similar class with Peggy in collaboration with Philoptochos.




