



#### Our Hope in the Resurrection


The "Christ Event", the power of the Resurrection, the transformation offered by the Resurrection continues to provide hope and comfort in the face of the tribulations of humanity and our ultimate physical death. We are reassured by this intervention of God that life does not end with the death of our bodies. Our spirit, our conscience, our soul lives on in the hands of God who has power over death and offers us eternal life "in a place where there is no pain, sorrow and suffering", but life everlasting!

Christ is Risen, brothers and sisters, offering hope to the whole world! Truly He is Risen, offering Life Eternal to all who seek Him!

#### **Hymn for Pascha**

It is the day of the Resurrection. Let us shine brightly for the festival, and also embrace one another. Brethren, let us say even to those who hate us, "Let us forgive everything for the Resurrection." And thus let us cry aloud, "Christ is risen from the dead, by death trampling down upon death, and to those in the tombs He has granted life."

## Let no one fear death!



The early Christian Fathers of the Church, following in the footsteps of St. Paul, pointed out frequently that *sin is the result of our fear of death*. Since our Fall from communion with God and from His Grace, we became slaves to sin and to the devil because of this fear (Heb. 2:15): We cling to earthly things, we become egocentric, we become greedy, we seek power and honor on this earth, thinking that we will overcome death this way. In the end we immerse ourselves in sin and become miserable. For centuries we wondered around waiting for redemption crying out as St. Paul: "O wretched man that I am! who shall deliver me from the body of this death?" (Rom. 7:24)

No one on earth could save us from sin. None of the angels could free us from this bondage to death. The only way for humanity to be

released from the bondage of sin, death and slavery to the devil was for death to be removed; death had to be destroyed.

And then there was the *Good News:* "For since by man came death, by man came also the resurrection of the dead." (1Cor. 15:21) And this man who brings about the resurrection is our Lord Jesus Christ. Being God and equal to the Father, He lowered Himself and took up our fallen nature that He might heal it. He died on the Cross in His humanity so that He might raise it up again and defeat our enemy death; for having defeated sin through His sinlessness, the last enemy remaining that had to be destroyed was death. (cf. 1Cor. 15:26)

Pascha is the celebration of the destruction of death and the release of humanity from this bondage. Pascha is the greatest miracle on behalf of humanity. Pascha is a time to rejoice, for humanity (with God's help) has become victorious. "Death is swallowed up in victory." (1Cor. 15:54)

St. Chrysostom declares in his Paschal Homily: "Let no one fear death; for the Death of our Savior has set us free. He has destroyed it by enduring it. He spoiled Hades when he descended thereto. He vexed it even as it tasted of his flesh."

This is what Pascha is about; it is a victory of humanity over death.

"Hades took a body, and, lo! it discovered God. It took earth, and, behold! it encountered Heaven. It took what it was, and was overcome by what it did not see. O death, where is thy sting? O Hades, where is thy victory? (1Cor. 15:55) Christ is risen, and you are annihilated. Christ is risen, and the evil ones are cast down. Christ is risen, and the Angels rejoice. Christ is risen, and life is liberated. Christ is risen, and the tomb is emptied of the dead; for Christ, having risen from the dead, has become the first-fruits of those that have fallen asleep. To him be glory and power forever and ever. Amen" (*Paschal Homily of St.* John Chrysostom)

Join us, my brothers and sisters, to celebrate the destruction of death and our liberation from it. Join us, that you may share in this joy! J. Fr. Pameyistis

## Is action preferable to prayer? Just think of this

There is a trend among Christians today to move away from prayer and worship and to take social and political action; we thus move away from engaging God to engaging in the needs and problems of humankind, which will never end since we are in a fallen condition.

Of course, the need for such involvement in helping others, such as, in the cause for justice and against injustice, in the fight for rights and freedoms, and even in an effort to bring the Gospel to all men, although urgent and needful, still begs the question: Should prayer and worship be given up for it's sake?

The answer is NO. Only in the light of prayer and in the presence of God, can man see himself clearly and make clear decisions. Only in this light can we clearly assess situations accurately and arrive at the answers to the problems that beset humanity. And only through prayer can man receive the strength to do something effective about the problems of the world.

In addition, the more aware we become of the vastness of the problems confronting us, the more we will recognize our own smallness, and thus turn to God in prayer for solutions. We need to realize that everything depends on God. We can only be His agents: "Unless the Lord build the house, they labor in vain that build it." (Ps. 126).

## You are a Member of the Church! Are you a Steward also?

A question always asked by our parishioners is "How can I be a member of the Parish? I am already an Orthodox Christian. Isn't that enough?

The answer to this is very simple: All people baptized and chrismated (confirmed) in the Orthodox Church are automatically members of the Church, but it takes a little more to be "members in good standing" in the Orthodox Church and in the Parish. First, it is required that a person be married in the Church and live their life as an Orthodox Christian, participating in the Holy Sacraments, in order to be in good standing within the Orthodox Church. If one has been married outside the Orthodox Church or has gone through a civil divorce and has not obtained a Church divorce may not be in good standing with the Church. Please check with the priest of the parish in order to find out where you are.

#### How can one be a member of the Parish?

It takes participation in the parish by supporting the operation and ministries of the parish to be a member in good standing. In order to do that, you have to fill out the Membership/Stewardship Form and indicate on it how you are going to participate in the Parish with your Time, Talents and Treasure. When you join the Parish in this way you make a Pledge to God that you will support the work of the Church with the gifts He has given you so that the Gospel may be preached and people may be saved through the ministries of the Church. **Please join us at Holy Transfiguration and serve God with us!**

#### ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS FREQUENTLY ASKED ABOUT PARISH MEMBERSHIP AND STEWARDSHIP

#### Why should I complete a Membership/Stewardship Form?

- •When we were baptized, promises were made to serve Christ as our Lord and King for our entire life So if you have not since rejected Him, you are still pledged to serve Him with your life and there is no better way to do so than serve His Church, His parish where His work is done.
- •To show Him that you love Him and thank Him for your abundant blessings, there is no better way to respond than complete the Membership/Stewardship Form and indicate what you pledge to Him throughout the year. This is a way to recommit your life to God every year.

#### Why do we have to complete a Membership/Stewardship (M/S) Form every year?

- •The Archdiocese Regulations requires us to do so in order to be in "Good Standing".
- •The Parish's needs change from one year to the next, so it is good for both parish and for us that we re-examine our commitment to the Universal Church (Christ's Living Body on earth) each year. By filling out a new form, we re-commit our gifts as per the needs of the Parish and the Church.
- •We provide accurate information about us and/or our families each year for the Parish records.



#### **Better Hear and Understand Our Services**

Are you experiencing difficulty understanding what is being said during services or during events in the Parish Hall?

We have two systems installed to assist you to better hear and understand what is being said. The systems are installed under the pews in Church and under the carpet in the Parish Hall. They work when the audio systems are in use and you are sitting in the pews or in the Parish Hall.

There are two ways you can take advantage of these hearing assist systems.

1. Use your existing personal hearing aid with the "T" coil feature turned on.

or

2. Use a receiver device available for your use.

Your audiologist can assist you in making sure your hearing aid has the "T" coil feature, and it is turned on. Most hearing aids today have a "T" coil option; however, not all have this feature.

If you would like to use a hearing device, please see a Parish Council member or a Greeter. There are only a few of these devices available for use during services and events, and they must be returned after use.

A hearing assist device can also be purchased at a cost of \$80 per unit. Please see Anne in the parish office.

# What Good Can Come from Grief?

It is not uncommon when confronted with a loss to respond like Scarlett O'Hara in *Gone with The Wind*: "Oh, I can't think about this now. I'll go crazy if I do! I'll think about it tomorrow." The problem is tomorrow often stretches into next week, next month, next year, and we successfully stuff away the sorrow and other difficult feelings associated with the loss. After all, what good can come from grieving and dwelling on bad things? Give it time and our hearts will heal. Isn't that what everyone does?

The problem with this thought process is we deny ourselves the opportunity to truly heal and to honor who or what has been lost. Despite western culture's reliance on rational thinking to solve life's troubles, loss is as much a spiritual injury as it is an emotional one. As Fr. Alexis Trader, the author of Ancient Christian Wisdom and Aaron Beck's Cognitive Therapy, observes, "We cannot think ourselves out of grief."

If we shut ourselves away from others and from God, we deprive ourselves of the healing power of our Lord, Jesus Christ and from the support we need to heal. Even worse, in thinking we can handle our grief all by ourselves, we may find ourselves deceived by the evil one whose primary goal is to distance us from our Lord and to destroy our relationship with Him.

I invite you to come to the Ladies Philoptochos Society Panagia Chapter's 2019 Lenten Retreat on Saturday, April 6<sup>th</sup> to learn more about the benefits of engaging with our grief and with our Lord in the midst of it. I assure you that even in the darkest days of grieving, there is the promise of brighter days, a purpose, or an invitation we may not have discerned before, and a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ. Recall during Holy Week how within the darkness and sorrow of Holy Friday and Holy Saturday, there is also the promise of Pascha.

I also invite you to join The Grief Recovery Support Group. We meet again on Saturdays, May 4<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> at 10 am in the St. Basil Conference Room. I am also available to meet with you privately. Please contact me for more information at 404.771.9335 or bjspanos@ ekteleo.org.





#### ST. PHILOTHEI PANTRY UPDATES

We are kicking off the month of April with a *Reverse Offering*. The Reverse Offering baskets will be passed following our church offering on Sunday, April 7. We will also pass a tray on Sunday, April 14.

Our pantry's shelves are bare, with the exception of canned vegetables and boxes of spaghetti leftover from our last food distribution day.

#### What is a Reverse Offering?

For those who have never participated in a Reverse offering before, here is how it works. We have colorful index cards with a short list of what the food pantry is in need of; each card has a different list on it. Baskets are passed on Sunday following the church offering tray. Anyone who wishes to donate a few grocery items to our food pantry selects a card or two and purchases what is on the list. If you select a card that may have too much on the list, you can always exchange it for another one. The remaining cards are placed in the Parish Hall in a basket for those who are not present on the Sunday when the tray is passed. Once you have your card and have purchased the items on your list, please bring them to the Parish Hall by Sunday, April 14. Label your bags "Food Pantry" so there is no confusion as to where these items need to go.

There are <u>2 options for dropping off your bags of in the Parish Hall:</u> Option 1 - At the main entrance, to your left, there is a plastic tub on the counter. That area is designated for pantry groceries. Option 2: On the lower level of the Parish Hall, you may leave your grocery items behind the bar located in the lobby.

If you are on vacation for the schools spring break the first week in April, please remember that the leftover cards are in the Parish Hall basket and may be picked up at any time.

\*\*If you have something that needs to be put in the freezer, please do not leave it out in the lobby area. Each Sunday and only on Sunday, we will put out a cooler for those of you bringing frozen items that are on the list. If you intend to bring your groceries in sometime midweek, please let Isabelle or John know so that arrangements can be made to keep your items frozen until they can be placed in the food pantry freezers. Due to our cooking preparations for Greek Festival, we do not have the space in our Parish Hall freezer to accommodate food pantry items.

A few things to keep in mind when shopping for the pantry: We are making a huge effort to offer more healthy food items so instead of just canned food, we are trying provide more frozen food. Our families range in size from 8 individuals per family to 1. \*We provide according to the size of each family. Any items we receive in bulk must be broken up into smaller quantities which requires volunteer hours. Bigger is great if the items are individually packed or wrapped and can be easily distributed in smaller portions. For example: a 124 – load of laundry detergent would be great for one of our larger families but all our families need this item. We can provide the same item to more families if smaller containers (e.g., 30 load) are purchased. Please keep this in mind with paper products as well. It's great to receive the bigger packs if they are individually wrapped within the "big package". The same is true for toilet paper. It is best to get 4 roles - per package to provide each family a (4 role package). The same with rice and pasta. Bigger is great if they are individually packed or wrapped, and we can distribute the items in smaller portions when the outer package is opened. A great time to buy is when the grocery stores are offering BOGO's (Buy one Get one free) or 10 for \$10 at Kroger.

#### We are always in need of the following items:

Frozen Pre packaged Chicken tenders & Chicken breasts, frozen hamburgers. Shampoo, Conditioner & Body Wash – various hygiene products for women & Men - paper towels – toilet paper – liquid laundry detergent – dishwasher soap pods – boxed cereal - mac & cheese boxes – mac & cheese in individual microwavable containers - 1 lb bag of rice – peanut butter creamy & crunchy - milk in a carton that can be stored on a shelf (our families in government housing have limited freezer & fridge space since they don't have regular size refrigerators in their rooms.
