


Directions to our Parish:

In this new world of the digital age, however, though we travel far and wide we manage to stay connected even with those we leave behind! Facebook and other social media help us exchange messages, photos and even live videos from many thousands of miles away. We remain close to everyone - *just a mouse-click away*. Many of us have iPhones and androids, iPads and laptops and we carry them around looking for a signal to get us online. Our voice



St. Olympias the Deaconess - July 25

St. Olympias was born in 361 AD into a wealthy family of high ranking in the Christian Roman Empire (probably in Constantinople). Her father was the senator Anicius Secundus and through her mother, Alexandroka, she was the granddaughter of the noted eparch Eulalios.

When Olympias was still very young, her parents betrothed her to a nobleman. The marriage was supposed to take place when Olympias reached the age of maturity. However, the bridegroom died before the wedding took place, and Olympias did not wish to enter into another marriage, preferring a life of virginity.

After the death of her parents, Olympias inherited great wealth. She then began to distribute this wealth to the poor and needy, the orphaned and the widowed. She was also very generous with her donations to the



churches, monasteries, hospices, and shelters for the homeless. She established a hospital and a shelter for young orphaned girls and undertook their care and education. She also established a monastery for women where she resided, as well. All of her wealth was put to work for the benefit and comfort of the poor of Constantinople.

Because of her many philanthropic activities, she was appointed a deaconess by the holy Patriarch Nektarios (381-397). She would provide great assistance to the hierarchs of Constantinople as well as the visiting bishops from many places.

She became especially close to St. John Chrysostom, who was elevated to Archbishop of Constantinople on February 26 of 398. St. Chrysostom had high regard for Olympias and showed her goodwill and spiritual love. When Chrysostom was unjustly banished in 404 AD, Olympias and the other deaconesses (Pentadia, Proklia, and Salbina) were deeply upset. Eventually, Olympias was sent to exile because of her devotion to St. Chrysostom's innocence. St. John Chrysostom wrote to her several letters from his exile, consoling her in her sorrow.

St. John Chrysostom reposed on September 14, 407. Almost a year later, St. Olympias died in exile as well after a long illness somewhere in Nicomedia on July 25, 408. Shortly before her death, Olympias gave instructions that her remains be placed in a coffin and tossed into the sea, leaving her final resting place to divine providence. Her coffin was washed on the shores of Constantinople and she was interned in the Church of the Holy Apostle Thomas. Later her holy relics were brought to the monastery which she had established. Many miracles and healings occurred from her relics.

You are a Member of the Church! Are you a Steward also?

A question always asked by our parishioners is "How can I be a member of the Parish? I am already an Orthodox Christian. Isn't that enough?

The answer to this is very simple: All people baptized and chrismated (confirmed) in the Orthodox Church are automatically members of the Church, but it takes a little more to be "members in good standing" in the Orthodox Church and in the Parish. First, it is required that a person be married in the Church and live their life as an Orthodox Christian, participating in the Holy Sacraments, in order to be in good standing within the Orthodox Church. If one has been married outside the Orthodox Church or has gone through a civil divorce and has not obtained a Church divorce may not be in good standing with the Church. Please check with the priest of the parish in order to find out where you are.

How can one be a member of the Parish?

It takes participation in the parish by supporting the operation and ministries of the parish to be a member in good standing. In order to do that, you have to fill out the Membership/Stewardship Form and indicate on it how you are going to participate in the Parish with your Time, Talents and Treasure. When you join the Parish in this way you make a Pledge to God that you will support the work of the Church with the gifts He has given you so that the Gospel may be preached and people may be saved through the ministries of the Church. **Please join us at Holy Transfiguration and serve God with us!**

ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS FREQUENTLY ASKED ABOUT PARISH MEMBERSHIP AND STEWARDSHIP

Why should I complete a Membership/Stewardship Form?

- •When we were baptized, promises were made to serve Christ as our Lord and King for our entire life So if you have not since rejected Him, you are still pledged to serve Him with your life and there is no better way to do so than serve His Church, His parish where His work is done.
- •To show Him that you love Him and thank Him for your abundant blessings, there is no better way to respond than complete the Membership/Stewardship Form and indicate what you pledge to Him throughout the year. This is a way to recommit your life to God every year.

Why do we have to complete a Membership/Stewardship (M/S) Form every year?

- •The Archdiocese Regulations requires us to do so in order to be in "Good Standing".
- •The Parish's needs change from one year to the next, so it is good for both parish and for us that we re-examine our commitment to the Universal Church (Christ's Living Body on earth) each year. By filling out a new form, we re-commit our gifts as per the needs of the Parish and the Church.



SURRENDER AND IMMERSE

Fr. Panayiotis often encourages us during times of trouble to surrender to Jesus Christ and His love and to immerse ourselves in worship and prayer. Both lead us to a deeper relationship with our Lord, the physician of our souls, and to the healing of sadness and sorrows that trouble us. This is particularly true when it comes to grieving a loss, whether it be the death of a loved one, divorce, loss of a beloved pet, moving, losing a job, a falling out with a friend, health issues, retiring, empty nesters, and many other types of losses we each experience. Grieving is also made easier when we feel supported, rather than isolated.



Dr. George Bonanno, a professor of clinical psychology at Columbia University and a recognized researcher into bereavement and trauma, observes: "Bereavement [and grieving] is a powerful experience, even for the most resilient among us, and it sometimes dramatically shifts our perspectives on life...The death of a loved one [as do other types of losses] tends to peel back the curtain on those existential questions, at least temporarily, and begs us to take a larger view of the world and our place in it." It is this shift of perspective that allows us to begin the journey not around or over the block of grief, but through it.

Dr. Jerry Sittser, who lost several family members in a horrific drunk driving accident, chose to lean into his grief and to let his experience of loss take him on this journey, yet he had no idea where he would end up. He chose to head east through the darkness and toward the sunrise and to allow himself to be transformed by suffering rather than avoiding it. When we take this journey through grief and focus on our experiences along the way, with God's help we can gain a greater understanding of ourselves, heal our grief, and grow personally and spiritually.

Please come to the Grief Recovery Support Group as we gain wisdom from Dr. Jerry Sittser's book, A Grace Disguised: How the Soul Grows Through Loss. This is not a book study per se but is being used to inspire our discussions. We meet again on Saturdays, June 8th, June 22nd, July 6th, August 3rd and August 17th at 10 am in the St. Basil Conference Room. I am also available to meet with you privately. 

<u>Description of Duties: Fresh Produce Shopper</u>. Buys the fresh produce a day or two before our open market (distribution day) and brings the items to the pantry the day before and helps set up for distribution day.

Market Assistant: Assists the families as they make their selections in the market, bags the groceries as they are selected.

Grocery Carrier: Helps families carry & load groceries into their cars

<u>Dinner Set up & Clean Up</u>. Food table set up (under the carport), setting out paper plates, plastic utensils and condiments. Additional small tables (1-2) & Chairs for the families to eat dinner. Assists dinner host with serving the meal if needed. Helps the dinner host clean up once everyone has eaten.

<u>Dinner Host/s:</u> Prepares a meal for approx. 20-25 Doesn't have to be fancy just a healthy, kid friendly meal. (this is great opportunity for those who have extended family to come together and host a meal, or even good friends to come together and host a meal)

Grocery check - in 4 stocker: Checks in all groceries, marking thru bar codes, enters dates on all canned items. Breaks down bags of chicken breasts and beef hamburger patties to smaller quantities. Restocks the front market area. Restocks the refrigerator in the market area with veggies, frozen meals.

Organizes the freezers by category of frozen items and then by size.
