#### **Receiving Holy Communion**

Orthodox Christians who have prepared spiritually are invited to come forward "with the fear of God, with faith, and with love" to receive Holy Communion.

Non-Orthodox Christians may receive the blessed bread (*antidoron*) offered at the conclusion of the service, but not Holy Communion. They may come up to receive a blessing during Holy Communion if they wish.

Preparation for Holy Communion includes confession of sins (even of sinful thoughts) and repentance, making peace with those around us, forgiving those who hurt us, asking for forgiveness from those we have hurt, and prayer. There is a special set of prayers called "Preparation for Holy Communion" to help prepare.

If you have further questions regarding the proper preparation for Holy Communion, please speak with Fr. Panayiotis.




Called to Serve: New Bishop, New Diocese, New Challenges

#### ICONOGRAPHY UPDATE - Next Phase



As everyone is aware, the installation of the new iconography in the Church is moving ahead and is targeted to be completed before Holy Week this month!! If you have not seen the work in progress, it is truly stunning. We are pleased to let everyone know that we have an opportunity to continue our iconography project later this fall in the October timeframe. Thanks to the organic donations from throughout our parish, we have the funds available to cover the cost of the painting of the Ascension of Christ, shown above. This iconography work will cover the arch over the Solea (the elevated area in front of the iconostastion). However in order for this work to be installed, we need to raise \$12,000 to cover the cost of the scaffolding. If your patron Saint is one of the Apostles of Christ, here's you chance to sponsor your Saint in some small way. Let us all come together and make this happen.

There is also a separate opportunity to totally complete the iconography in the front of our Church with the installation of Saints Peter and Paul (shown above). Saint Peter will be installed on the wall next to the baptistry and St. Paul will be installed on the wall next to the Shrine of St. Nektarios. The background for both will be gold leaf. Two Seraphims will flank the center light fixture on a field of blue over each area. The cost of each icon is \$12,500. There are a number of individuals in our community whose patron Saints (or a family

member's) are Peter or Paul. This is a wonderful opportunity to join forces with others whose patron Saints are Peter and Paul and together have these two wonderful icons completed this October along with the Ascension of Christ.

We are so close to being able to complete the rest of the iconography for the front of our Church. We only need \$37,000 in total. During this Pascha season, let's all come together once again and make this a reality. Once we have completed this work, our iconography funds will be nearly exhausted and our next effort will be a parish wide fund raising campaign similar to our building fund effort and will be spread over a 3 to 5 year period of time. The goal of this campaign is to completely finish the iconography in our beautiful Sanctuary. More on this will be coming early next year.
